

TASMANIA.

COST OF SURVEY DEPARTMENT.

Presented by Mr. Innes, and ordered by the House to be printed, 29 January, 1862.

SIR,

I have the honor of placing before you a Table, compiled from Parliamentary Records, showing the respective costs of the Survey Departments of the three oldest Colonies of this portion of the Empire,—namely, New South Wales, Victoria, and Tasmania,—during the Years 1858, 1859, and 1860; and giving a comparative view of the money-value and usefulness of their operations.

In examining the Table, it will be seen that, notwithstanding the singular and nearly unequalled difficulties which the surface of Tasmania presents to the Surveyor (at least three times heavier than those of the other Colonies), our progress here has been the greater of the three; that is to say, we have prepared for sale, and have sold, more land, according to our population, than either of the others; though, from the unfavourable circumstances under which our operations are carried on, they ought to have surpassed us threefold. It will also be seen that the cost of our work per acre, which is always below that charged to the Victorian Revenue, is very greatly under that of New South Wales; being about four times less costly than New South Wales in 1858, five times in 1859, and six times so in 1860.

The document now respectfully presented to the Honorable the Executive is offered in defence of a Department charged with conducting its operations, not only without regard to economy, but with an amount of extravagance which has been described as perfectly monstrous, and exhibiting such a degree of recklessness as to call for the interposition of the Legislature to restrain it by giving existence to an entirely new element in its management.

The communities of the great Australian Provinces, with whose Survey operations I have compared our own, abound with professional men to a degree utterly unknown here, from whom they doubtless receive a far greater amount of information on all professional subjects of great moment to them, which cannot be expected here for many a year. Yet there, so I am informed, no such complaints are made against their Survey Departments as are cast on us, whose operations bear so favourable a contrast with theirs,—as, indeed, they will with those of any other Country. For, take the labours of whatever year of the series presented us that we please, and it will be found that, both in economy of our Survey expenditure and the progress of occupation (according to population), Tasmania can show the best accounts of the three. This fact, taken with due consideration of the difficulties that opposed our progress, should, I humbly submit, give birth to other expressions than those lately used towards us, wherein censure is the predominating element; but which, relying on the strong sentiment of justice that pervades the community, I feel assured the accompanying document will dissipate.

^{*} Note.—I cannot discover in the Statistical Registers of either New South Wales or Victoria that any portion of the cost of surveying lands is recovered on the sale of the same as is done in Tasmania. The lengthened papers on the subject of the fees collected by the Governments of those Colonies are silent on the subject.

† Note.—In the "Average Column" of Salaries of New South Wales and Victoria considerable differences will be observed in those of the same class of employees, which is attributable in a great degree to the frequent changes in the strength of staff during the year, whereby partial salaries are paid (for broken periods of the year). In the Department of Tasmania these changes are quite unknown, and therefore no great diversity in the average salaries of the fixed staff will be seen. There have in fact been—to the credit of the service be it said—neither dismissal nor retirement for very many years, though with an increasing business there has been a moderate augmentation of Staff.
