

BOARD OF IMMIGRATION:

REPORT FOR 1882.

Laid upon the Table by Mr. Moore, and ordered by the Council to be printed, July 24, 1883.



Immigration Office, Hobart, 2nd April, 1883.

SIR,
THE Board of Immigration have the honor to forward their Report for the year ending 31st December, 1882.

There has been a considerable increase in the number of Immigrants introduced under the Bounty System during the year, the number in 1882 having been 141 as against 59 in 1881.

The Immigrants in 1882 consisted of fifteen married males, twenty married females, sixteen single males, and twenty-two single females, thirty-three male and thirty-five female children.

The cost to the Board for the introduction of these Immigrants amounted to £1379.

Forty-eight males and fifty-eight females came from England, eleven males and twelve females from Ireland, three males and six females from Scotland, and one male and two females from Germany.

Land Certificates under the 7th Section of the Act of Parliament, 31 Vict. No. 26, were issued to seventy-seven individuals, entitling the holders to select four thousand four hundred and fifty acres of the Waste Lands of the Crown.

These Certificates represent sixty-four males, fifty-five females, and one hundred and thirty-four children,—in all two hundred and fifty-three souls.

Twenty-eight Land Orders were issued under the 5th Section of the same Act, entitling the holders to select or purchase at any Government Land Sale twelve hundred and eighty-seven acres of the Waste Lands of the Crown.

These Orders represent thirty-five males and twenty-three females fifteen years of age and upwards, and twenty-seven children under fifteen,—in all eighty-five souls.

During the year the Board issued twenty-four family, seventeen male, and thirty-two female Bounty Tickets. Of these, three family, four male, and two female tickets were subsequently returned unused, and cancelled.

The Agents of the Board in London also issued four family, seven male, and eleven female tickets.

The purchase money of the tickets issued amounted to £875, from which must be deducted the amount refunded to the purchasers on account of cancelled tickets,—namely, £95.

The balance at the disposal of the Board on the 31st December, irrespective of the outstanding account with the London Agency, amounted to £31,199 9s. 10d.

An Act was passed on the 6th November, 1882, reconstructing the Board by the addition of two members, and also extending and defining the power of the Board to make rules and regulations. This Act appropriates the sum of £30,000 for the purpose of assisting Immigration to Tasmania during the years 1883, 1884, and 1885, which amount is included in the above-mentioned balance.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act the Board proceeded to make Regulations, which have duly received the approval of the Governor in Council, and steps were taken to ascertain the character and amount of labour required to meet the pressing wants of the Colony.

At the request of the Government, Mr. Frank B. Treatt, Chief Clerk in the Immigration Office in Sydney, was permitted to visit Tasmania, and much valuable information was furnished by him relative to the system adopted by the Government of New South Wales as regards assisted Immigration.

Arrangements have been made with Mr. T. C. Just for the preparation of a Hand-book on Tasmania for general distribution, more especially in Great Britain. This book will be accompanied by a map showing the alienated and unalienated lands, and the various mineral districts, &c.

Since the commencement of the present year the Board have appointed a gentleman as Emigration Agent, who, after visiting the various country districts and principal towns, will proceed to England to select Emigrants and arrange for their conveyance to the Colony. In the meantime the Emigrant and Colonists' Aid Corporation, the present Agents of the Board in London, have been requested to continue to act under the amended Regulations relating to assisted Emigration.

In view of the constantly increasing work of the office, requiring more time than their Secretary and Agent could devote to its discharge in conjunction with the duties otherwise devolving upon him, the Board have accepted his resignation and have appointed a gentleman whose services will be entirely at their disposal.

Appended are the usual Returns prepared by the Immigration Agent, five relating to the operations of the Board under the Bounty System, and two to transactions under the Acts of Parliament, 31 Vict. No. 26, and 38 Vict. No. 16.

A statement is also appended showing the acreage selected and purchased by the holders of Land Certificates and Land Orders during the year 1882.
