

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

LITTLE has occurred in the history and management of the Institution under our care since the date of our last Report requiring special notice.

Nothing, we believe, has been omitted to promote the health and comfort of the Patients.

The average number treated in the Hospital during the year was precisely the same as in the previous year, while the number remaining at the termination of 1874 was one less than at the end of 1873, thus showing for the first time a reduction in the number of inmates instead of an increase.

## No. 5.

RETURN of Work performed by Patients in co-operation with the Carpenter and Painter in the Hospital for the Insane, New Norfolk, during the Year 1874.

New Work.—Pigstye; pig-yard fenced off; cover to weighbridge; swing to ladies' cottage; trestles for tank, ladies' cottage; trestles for cook-house tank; latrines for boys; shed for boys; shed to wash-house; table for attendant's room; 2 pig troughs; 1 horse cart; 1 large horse cart; 1 horse dray; 2 clothes horses; sexagon shed for wash-house; stable for bull; cradle for girls; shute over mill-race; railings to front steps, new building; 4 barrow-wheels; 4 wheelbarrows; latrine, cowman's hut; meat safe; frame to horse-dray; 25 coffins; 1 shed for carts, 34 feet long by 17 feet wide; wood mauls; axe handles, and others, &c.

Repairs.—Fence, cells, yard, Female Division; hut at Dr. Huston's quarters; horse dray; verandah, back yard; bath, Female Division; sub-matron's kitchen re-shingled; horses in drying-room; fences at Dr. Huston's; fences all round the farm; verandah, Female Division; tables and chairs throughout; mangle, rinsing machine, wheelbarrows, mauls, wood-horses, shower-baths, bread-trough, and general repair of floors, &c. in wards, cells, &c. throughout the Hospital.

Painter.—Fences, &c., Dr. Huston's; carts and dray; Sub-Matron's quarters; new building throughout; No. 7 Ward front, &c.

Plumber .-- Pipes to bath-house; pipes throughout kept in repair.

Glazier.-79 squares of glass put in, and skylights, &c. kept in repair.

Whitewashing and Colouring.—Sub-Matron's quarters; new building, both inside and out; 5, 6, and 7 Wards, front; back yard and corridor; sundry wards, Female Division.
