

# FOR DEFRAYING THE COST OF COMPLETING THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE HUON ROAD.

....Vote-£1000.

ROAD & BRIDGES from the Township of Upway to the Gold-fields at Waterhouse, including a Bridge over the Great Forester River and the Road through Stephenson's Marsh; and a Road from the Landing Place at the Tomahawh to the Gold-fields at Waterhouse; and also a Track from Tucker's Corner to Waterhouse, &c.

#### POLICE BUILDINGS THROUGHOUT THE COLONY.

### Vоте—£1000.

Upon the representation of the Inspector of Police as to the urgent necessity for the erection of Police Offices, &c. at Emu Bay and Mount Bischoff, plans and specifications were prepared by this Department, and tenders invited for the work. That of W. Stutterd at £554 8s. for Emu Bay offices, and £38 16s. for furniture for same, was authorised to be accepted, and the work is progressing. No tenders were received in reply to the advertisement for buildings at Mount Bischoff. Subsequently an offer was made for the work, which however was not entertained, and the matter at present remains in abeyance.

It has become absolutely necessary for a Police Court to be erected at George's Bay. Plan and specification has therefore been prepared by this Department, and tenders are now invited for the work. Further provision will be required for this and other stations.

## 31 VICT. No. 24.

#### CUTTING TRACKS THROUGH CROWN LANDS.

#### Vote-£2000.

An expenditure of £50 was authorised out of this vote for works on Hall's Track, Launceston to Mount Cameron, which were carried out by men on day work.

#### TRACK FROM SNUG RIVER TO NICHOLL'S RIVULET, (PORT CYGNET).

This track has been marked out a distance of about 8 miles. A further inspection of the line will be made before the work of clearing is commenced. A sum of £250 is reserved from this vote for the work.

This track will open up a considerable extent of Crown land suitable for settlement, give access to the lower portion of the District, and provide a shorter route, by way of Brown's River, to Hobart Town.

#### WORKS, GEORGE'S BAY AND GOULD'S COUNTRY TO THOMAS'S PLAINS.

In January last the late Minister instructed Mr. J. W. Brown (District Surveyor) to survey and lay out line of road from Gould's Country to Thomas's Plains, and arrange for the clearing, &c. to be immediately proceeded with Labourers were then engaged, and have been since employed under Overseers Alfred and J. R. Hall in clearing, cutting, and forming the tracks, commencing about 4 miles from George's River Bridge; 3 miles have been cleared out 30 feet wide, and formed 12 feet. From thence towards the Plains about one mile has been cleared out, and cutting formed 9 feet wide. A further distance of 3 miles on other branch has been cleared, and one mile of side cutting done. Owing to the large amount of traffic the main portion of road from George's River Bridge (a distance of about 7 miles to junction) was nearly impassable, and the men for the past six weeks have been engaged in procuring slabs and putting dangerous places on this part in order. Further provision will be required for these works.

#### THE PUBLIC WORKS CONSTRUCTION ACT, 1875.

For defraying the Cost of additional Buildings and Alterations at the Cascades Establishment in Hobart Town.

#### VOTE-£5000.

Plans and specifications were prepared for these works and tenders received in April last. The lowest, that of E. G. Ford at £5350, was accepted; also for any extras or deductions that might be ordered by the Director of Public Works at the prices stated in Schedule attached to tender.

Mr. James Moore, who had been previously employed for several years as working overseer with Prison Gang, being a mason and bricklayer by trade, was appointed as overseer constantly to supervise these works.

Under date 31st August this contract was placed under the supervision of Mr. Henry Hunter, Architect, who has appointed a Clerk of Works instead of Overseer Moore, whose services in this respect were discontinued from the 2nd September.

Certain materials are provided by the Government for these works; viz. iron and glass obtained from England, hardwood boards supplied under separate contract, and bricks procured from Port Arthur.

Owing to unforeseen circumstances in connexion with bad foundations and nature of ground a large expenditure has been incurred for concrete which was never anticipated when plans were prepared. The total cost of works under present contract is estimated as under—

## FOR DEFRAYING THE COST OF ERECTING A LINE OF TELEGRAPH FROM DELORAINE TO CIRCULAR HEAD,

And providing all Works and Appliances connected therewith.

Vote-£4000.

The construction of this Line has been completed, and the balance of vote is now being expended in clearing timber in order to prevent interruptions through breakages, which otherwise might frequently occur. The maintenance of the Line in working order is provided for under the following contracts:—

From Deloraine to Don, R. A. Dargaville, at £50 per annum. From Don to Circular Head, Patk. O'Neill, at £80 per annum.

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#### SUPPLEMENTARY ESTIMATES.

#### PENGUIN CREEK BREAKWATER.

Authorised by Governor in Council—£650.

The late Government considered it very necessary, in order to prevent further and perhaps total injury by gales to this Breakwater, (constructed in 1873 under the provisions of the Local Public Works Act,) to have certain additional works carried out. Public tenders were invited, but those received were considered too high. Subsequently Mr. Wm. Andrews made an offer for the work at £600, which was accepted by the late Government. When about to commence operations the Contractor was notified that the work was not to be proceeded with till further instructions, and the matter remains in abeyance at present as there are no funds available for this service.

#### EMU BAY JETTY.

Under date 8th November, 1875, the Governor in Council sanctioned the purchase of a crane for this jetty; at a cost not exceeding £120—to be provided upon Supplementary Estimate. The crane was obtained from Melbourne, and the sum of £112 12s. 6d. has been paid on account thereof, as per details.

#### ADDITIONS, CUSTOMS BUILDINGS, LAUNCESTON.

Authorised by Governor in Council—£900.

The necessity for additional accommodation at Customs Buildings, Launceston, has long been felt, and the matter has often been brought under notice. Under the instructions of the late Minister plans and specification of the same were prepared by Mr. Mills, (Architect,) Launceston, which were approved of by the Government, and tenders received for the work in July last. That of Messrs. J. & T. Gunn at £796, being the lowest, was accepted, and the work is being proceeded with under Mr. Mills' supervision, in accordance with the instruction of the late Government. The cost of these additions (including expense of supervision) is authorised by the Governor in Council to be provided for by Supplementary Estimate, there being no vote of Parliament for the service.

### EXPLORING EXPEDITION—MT. BISCHOFF TO WEST COAST.

Authorised by Governor in Council-£200.

This expedition was authorised by the late Government, and the expense ordered to be provided upon Supplementary Estimate.

## RINGAROOMA DISTRICT.—ROAD FROM KRUSKA'S BRIDGE TO THE PORT OF RINGAROOMA.

Owing to the increasing importance of mineral operations in this district, the late Government, on the 3rd July last, sanctioned an expenditure of £500 for works on road from the Ringarooma River, near its junction with the Thomas's River to the Port of Ringarooma, such works to be of a permanent and substantial character, suitable for cart traffic, and to be carried out in such a manner as to be of use in the further formation of the permanent line. The application in this matter was made by the Mount Cameron and Ringarooma Road Association; the arrangements proposed for proceeding at once with these works were sanctioned by the Government, and a party of men under Overseer Fahey immediately commenced operations, following up the surveyed line of Mr. J. R. Hurst, who reports under date 10th August that they have been judiciously and well executed. The total expense incurred to date is about £700, towards which the Government have contributed £350. Upon further representation of this association that it would be compelled to suspend the

works for the want of funds, and if completion of the road were interrupted a most serious check would have been given to the opening up of a very productive mineral district, and to the improvement of an extensive area of rich agricultural land, advantage was taken of the party then engaged on the work, and a further sum of £500 sanctioned by the Governor in Council, under date 11th September, for continuing operations till the decision of Parliament could be ascertained thereon. The men are now proceeding therewith under the immediate direction and supervision of this Department.

## RINGAROOMA DISTRICT.—ROAD FROM RINGAROOMA ROAD TO MINERAL SELECTIONS, CASCADE RIVER.

Under instructions of the late Minister, Mr. Frith proceeded to Ringarooma to report upon this line, and take particulars of necessary works. Tenders were received for clearing portion thereof, and that of Messrs. Gunton and Rainbow accepted at £80 per mile, for a distance of  $4\frac{3}{4}$  miles towards Belmont; the remaining part of line not being decided on. Subsequently the Contractors declined to proceed with the work, and no further action has been taken in the matter, there being no provision by Parliament for this service.

### ROADS AND BRIDGES, CASTRA, DEVON.

Tenders were invited in August, 1875, for forming, metalling, bridging, and other works on the western branch of the East Castra road, but the only one received was considered far too high,—viz., £855. Robert Miller afterwards undertook the works at £498 15s., but failed to carry out or even commence the same. Subsequently the tender of George Simmons at £495 was accepted, and he has received £280 on account thereof; but the matter of payment of balance is not yet settled.
