

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

PENSIONS AND COMPENSATION:

ORDERS IN COUNCIL UNDER SUPERANNUATION ACT.

Laid upon the Table by Mr. Crowther, Sept. 19; and ordered by the Council to be printed, October 13, 1876.



ORDERS of the Governor in Council made under "The Superannuation Act" since the last Meeting of Parliament.

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 20, 1875.

MINUTE No. 263.

THE Colonial Secretary submits that upon the recommendation of the Sheriff, Christopher Sherlock, Constable at the House of Correction for Males, Launceston, be permitted to retire from the public service in consequence of infirmity of body, and that he be granted a Retiring Allowance at the rate of £19 19s. 8d. per annum.

The Governor approves: to take effect on 1st July last, and to be provided for on Supplementary Estimate.

MONDAY, DECEMBER 13, 1875.

MINUTE No. 350.

The Governor approves of the following recommendations submitted by the Colonial Secretary:—

1. That William Ward, Chief District Constable at Three Hut Point, be allowed to retire from the public service; that in consideration of the faithful and efficient manner in which he has performed his duties, the period of service be calculated from the time when he joined the Police Force, (8th February, 1838,) and that he be granted a Retiring Allowance of £92 10s. per annum: to take effect on 1st January next, and to be provided for upon a Supplementary Estimate.

MONDAY, JANUARY 31, 1876.

MINUTE No. 32.

The Governor approves of the following recommendations of the Colonial Secretary:-

That Mr. Edward Innes, late Police Clerk and Chief District Constable at Kingston, whose services have been dispensed with in consequence of the re-organisation of the Police Department, be granted a Retiring Allowance at the rate of £103 6s. 8d. per annum.

To take effect on the 1st instant: the amount of Pension for the present year to be charged upon the Supplementary Estimates.

Also, that there be paid to Mr. Innes on his retirement the sum of £50, to which he is entitled under the Minute of the Governor in Council, No. 227, of the 6th July, 1863. The amount to be also placed upon the Supplementary Estimates.

MONDAY, JUNE 5, 1876.

MINUTE No. 139.

His Excellency approves of Mrs. Mary Smith, Matron of the Queen's Asylum, New Town, being allowed to retire from the public service, in consequence of continued ill-health, on a Superannuation Allowance of £46 14s. 6d; per annum, commencing on the 1st July next.

The amount for the present year to be placed on the Supplementary Estimates.

MONDAY, JULY 17, 1876.

MINUTE No. 206.

His Excellency grants the following Pensions or Superannuation Allowances:-

1. *

2. To Thomas Gardiner, late Crier of the Supreme Court at Hobart Town, a Retiring Allowance of £52 per annum.

To have effect on the 1st April last; the amount for 1876 to be provided for on the Supplementary Estimates.

3. On the recommendation of the Board of Education:

To Mr. John Young, Master of the Public School at Deloraine, a Retiring Allowance of £34 16s. 5d. per annum, commencing on 1st August next. The amount for 1876 to be provided for as before.

MINUTE No. 215.

On the recommendation of the Commissioners of the Hospital for the Insane, New Norfolk, His Excellency approves of Thomas Workman, Under Keeper, being allowed to retire from the public service in consequence of ill-health, and grants him a Retiring Allowance of £30 13s. 7d. per annum.

To take effect on the 1st August next, and the amount for 1876 to be placed upon the Supplementary Estimates.

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 4, 1876.

MINUTE No. 256.

The Colonial Secretary submits that Mr. John Young, late Schoolmaster of the Public School at Deloraine, be granted a Pension at the rate of £37 10s. 5d., instead of £34 16s. 5d., as approved by the Governor in Council on 17th July last, the increase arising from the fees being calculated for the three years ending 31st July, 1876, instead of to 31st December, 1875, as in the first instance.
