

In July 1866, and January 1867, I had the honor to furnish Reports, with descriptive particulars, accompanied by Statements of Expenditure (Parliamentary Papers No. 32 and No. 13,) on the several Works undertaken and in progress under the Act 29 Vict. No. 1.

I have now to submit, for the information of the Government, a further Report showing the Works that have been carried out, also those under contract and in progress, the disbursements made on account thereof, and the estimated probable amounts required to meet the outlay on existing contracts.

THÉ PATERSONIA AND RINGAROOMA ROAD.

(Length of Road $24\frac{1}{2}$ miles.)

The clearing and scrubbing on the first Section of the road between Patersonia and $9\frac{1}{2}$ -Mile Creek, to the full width of 66 feet for a distance of $9\frac{1}{2}$ miles under Hannibal Fencker's contract, has been completed, for parties representing Fencker, by Thomas Miller.

Owing to the Contractor having failed to complete the works within even a reasonable period after the expiration of the time named in his contract, his deposit of Thirty Pounds was forfeited to the Government, and paid into the Colonial Treasury.

On the second Section of $8\frac{1}{4}$ miles clearing and scrubbing to the width of 66 feet under Messrs. Hay and Co.'s contract, to the extent of $7\frac{1}{4}$ miles, has been carried out, and also partially grubbed to a width of 33 feet. The contract is rapidly progressing towards completion.

Third Section.—The entire Section of $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles is scrubbed throughout to a width of 66 feet. There are 3 miles cleared and completed, and on $3\frac{1}{4}$ miles the heavy timber is cut in lengths and in progress of being rolled off There are 20 men employed on this Section by Messrs. Hay and Co., who will complete their contract within a few weeks.

As previously reported, the contract of Messrs. Hay and Co. for forming road, cutting drains, and constructing culverts for a distance of two miles on this Section has been completed.

Also forming and constructing Road from Patersonia to Meredith Valley, a distance of 3 miles.

THE BRIDPORT, SCOTT'S NEW COUNTRY, AND RINGAROOMA ROAD.

(29 miles.)

On the Section between Scottsdale and the River Arnon, a distance of 9 miles, Martin Boland having failed to carry out his contract for clearing and scrubbing the line, his deposit was forfeited to the Government and paid into the Colonial Treasury. The works were, as previously reported, re-advertised; and under Campbell and Pearson's contract nearly 7 miles have been completed, and an additional mile and a half scrubbed to a width of 66 feet, and partially grubbed.

The contract will be finally completed on or before 15th of September. There are 19 men employed on the works.

Helmer's contract for clearing and scrubbing on the second Section to a width of 66 feet for a distance of $6\frac{1}{3}$ miles from the River Arnon towards Ringarooma River has been completed.

On the Section of $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles through Scottsdale from the 8th mile mark to where the road branches off to Ringarooma, the clearing and scrubbing under Tankard's contract has been, as previously reported, completed.

Also that of Barnett and Co., for forming on this Section two miles of road, and for cutting side drains and constructing culverts.

Helmer's contract for clearing and forming road, and constructing bridges and culverts thereon from Bridport to Scottsdale, a distance of 8 miles, has been completed, also for cutting 1325 chains of side and catch drains; but the final instalment is not payable to the Contractor until the road is kept and maintained in good order and condition for a period of two months from date of certificate of its completion.

PART OF DIRECT HUON ROAD FROM HOBART TO LESLIE.

$(10\frac{1}{2} \text{ miles.})$

The Section of road for two miles under Anderson and Co.'s contract for making, forming, and constructing same in accordance with the Plans, Sections, and particulars set forth and embodied in my Report to Parliament of 31st July, 1866, No. 32, was rendered up complete and maintained by the Contractors in accordance with the terms of contract to March last.

The other portion of road between the 2nd mile-stone and near to the terminus at Leslie, a most laborious work, constructed under the immediate supervision of this Department, was, so far as the funds available would admit, completed about the same period, the road having been for months previously used for traffic.

By Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor, under date the 18th of February, 1867, the boundaries of the new line were defined under "The Cross and Bye Roads Act, 1860," and the road proclaimed to be a Road District for the purpose in the said Act contained.

It has since been in the hands and under the management of the Trustees elected under His Excellency's Proclamation.

There has been an extensive and heavy traffic upon the road in the carting of piles, logs, sawn timber, palings, and firewood. No rate has been assessed or levied in the District for the maintenance of the road notwithstanding this heavy traffic, and I am informed that there has not even been the daily labour of two men expended by the Trustees on the line since the period of their election.

THE GOVERNMENT ROAD THROUGH FRANKLIN, HUON.

$(2\frac{1}{2} \ miles.)$

The whole of this line is a side cutting, and the work of a very heavy description. The contract for grubbing, clearing, and constructing the entire length of line, and for macadamising roadway, and for putting in culverts thereon, was taken by Bell and Fitzpatrick, who have completed their contract, and who, during the latter stages of the work, opened the road for traffic..

The Contractors are bound to maintain and keep the road in good order to 31st December next, when final payment of the balance on foot of the contract will be due.

WEST TAMAR ROAD.

As already reported, work carried on by Road Trustees.

ROAD FROM WEST TAMAR TO GREEN'S CREEK.

$(27\frac{1}{2} miles.)$

The scrubbing, clearing, and grubbing on the first Section of 12 miles from the West Tamar Road to the Supply Rivulet has been completed by the Contractors, Messrs. Brown and M^tDonnell.

The scrubbing, grubbing, and clearing on the second Section, a distance of $15\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the Supply Rivulet to Green's Creek, under Mr. Lobley's tender at $\pounds75^*$ per mile, has also been completed.

(41 miles.)

The clearing and grubbing was performed by contract. The forming of the line, and constructing same ready for rubbling and metalling, was carried out by paid daily labour, under the supervision of this Department. The fencing along the line has also been completed.

The rubbling and metalling of the first Section with ironstone to a width of 14 feet and a depth of 12 inches, to the extent of 380 rods, at $\pounds 1$ 5s. per rod, and on second Section to the extent of 150 rods at $\pounds 1$ 10s. per rod, is in course of being carried out under John Brock's contract, and will be finally completed about December next. The road is open for traffic.

BRIDGE OVER RIVER FORTH.

The bridge, which is of one span, supported by bow arches and trussed and carried by stone piers of coursed masonry, in accordance with the plan and specification, and as set forth in my previous Report, was completed and opened in April last under Messrs. Cummings, Raymond, and Co.'s contract. The work is a most substantial and creditable one, the Contractors having carried it out in a most satisfactory manner. The wooden approach or planked roadway from the bridge across the flat forming western approach was completed in March last.

BRIDGE OVER RIVER LEVEN AT ULVERSTONE.

A most substantial pile and timber Bridge completed by the Contractors Messrs. Cummings, Raymond, & Co., as already reported upon in January last.

BRIDGE OVER PROSSER'S RIVER.

The Bridge at Prosser's is also a most substantial work, and was completed by the Contractor, Mr. Gowland, in a most satisfactory manner as set forth in my report thereon to the Government under date 14th January. Final payment was made shortly after to the Contractor.

ULVERSTONE TRAMWAY (ROAD) RUNNING SOUTHERLY.

The Jetty at the terminus, as already reported, was completed under the Tender of Messrs. Cummings, Raymond, & Co. in November, 1866.

Under Matthew Tankard's Contract for clearing (assigned to him by Robinson Rutter) a very great delay occurred in the prosecution of this work, and Mr. Tankard's deposit was forfeited to the Government in accordance with the notification made in my previous report on the subject. The scrubbing and clearing to a width of 66 feet under the survey was carried out for a distance on the surveyed line of 11 miles 52 chains; owing, however, to the line running through inferior wet bottom land and heavy gradients a deviation had to be made: the first was near the 7th mile along a spur, and thence passing through Messrs. Crawford's, Marquis', and M'Pherson's uncleared land, thence through Mr. Carstairs' cleared paddock and along a surveyed road to Gould's paddock, thence to Crown land on his south side line, thence through the rich Crown lands ending on some very fine plains at the terminus of the work. The length that has been grubbed and cleared comprises 11 miles 52 chains of original 66 feet clearing, 10 miles 9 chains 20 feet ditto, 3 miles 23 chains 10 feet ditto,—in all 25 miles 4 chains as against the original 19 miles. The work was finally completed by Robert Miller, a sub-Contractor under Tankard.

NORTH WEST BAY AND SANDFLY TRAMWAY.

$(13\frac{1}{4} miles.)$

Clearings completed under Torpy's contract a distance of $8\frac{1}{4}$ miles, and under Good & Co.'s contract a distance of 5 miles.

A track has also been cut and cleared of scrub, grass, and fallen timber, under Tender of Jacob Roberts, of 5 feet wide on portion of road from the new Huon Road towards Mr. Kellaway's, on the old Sandfly Road, and creek cleared to prevent damage to cultivated land by floods at a cost of $\pounds 17$ 10s.

The line is not practicable for a tramway, as already stated in my progress report of January last, No. 13.

The vote under this head might be applied and well expended in an extension of the Huon Road to Victoria, and between Leslie and Port Cygnet.

PORT CYGNET ROAD.

$(3\frac{1}{4} \text{ miles.})$

The clearing and scrubbing of the line a distance of 6 miles was performed under tender of Brown and M'Donnell.

Messrs. Chesterman and Co. are carrying out the work of forming and constructing 3¹/₄ miles, a macadamised and slabbed road, in accordance with the petition of the inhabitants, and in forming side and catch drains, and putting in culverts along line.

The first mile, commencing at the steamer's jetty, has been so far completed as to admit of the traffic passing thereon.

On the remaining portion the culverts, drains, and bridges, together with the laying of the longitudinal logging, are completed, and about half a mile of the slabbed roadway laid.

The work will be rendered up in December next.

ROAD LEADING FROM SOUTHPORT TOWARDS PORT ESPERANCE.

The clearing and scrubbing of this line under Patrick Hill's contract, and under additional tender for 100 chains of deviations, has been completed.

Messrs. Fitzpatrick and Co., under their contract for slab road and jetty, are now proceeding with the forming of the roadway, and are splitting and collecting slabs for the line. About sufficient slabs have been procured to form one mile of road. There has not been any partial payment made as yet to Fitzpatrick & Co., under their contract.

TRAMWAY LEADING FROM PORT ESPERANCE TOWARDS SOUTHPORT.

In Reports Nos. 32 and 13, I stated that there had not been any steps taken towards the construction of this line, owing to the survey having been carried along and close to that of a private Tramway.

A track, however, is in course of being cut by Mr. P. Hill, in order that the line may be inspected, so as to determine what kind of road should be constructed.

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DOVER AND WALPOLE ROAD, PORT ESPERANCE.

On the work of scrubbing and clearing having been completed, tenders were invited for forming slab road and for jetty. The tenders of Messrs. Brown and M⁴Donnell were accepted, as set forth in report of January, 1867. Since that date the Contractors have formed about two miles of road-way, and have constructed several culverts and bridges. About one mile of slabbing has been laid, and sufficient slabs procured and on the line to complete the contract. The work will be finished about February or March, 1868.

FRANKLIN TRAMWAY.

($6\frac{1}{2}$ miles, and extended survey $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles.)

In my previous Reports I pointed out that this line was recommended for adoption by a Committee of the House, that it had been scrubbed and cleared, and on the completion found to be impracticable.

Messrs. Davis and Laffer, after inspecting, reported that there is very little indeed of good land, and no timber (with the exception of a small patch) available for traffic on the surveyed line of $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles, and that the line headed the gullies so that timber could not be dragged to it.

The Surveyor of the Tramway, Mr. George Innes, represented that, by an extension of $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles, a good practicable line could be obtained into a well-timbered country. The extended line, as surveyed and laid out, is of a most unsatisfactory description; and after personally inspecting it, I am of opinion that the work, if carried out even on the extended survey, would be a most unprofitable and unproductive work.

RIVER CAM TRAMWAY.

There has not been anything done beyond the survey of the line. (Vide Progress Reports.)

COMPLETION OF SORELL CAUSEWAY.

Works carried on by Mr. Oldham, under Trustees appointed by the Governor in Council under the provisions of "The Sorell Causeway Act."
