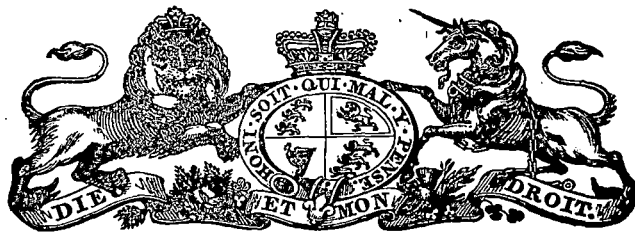

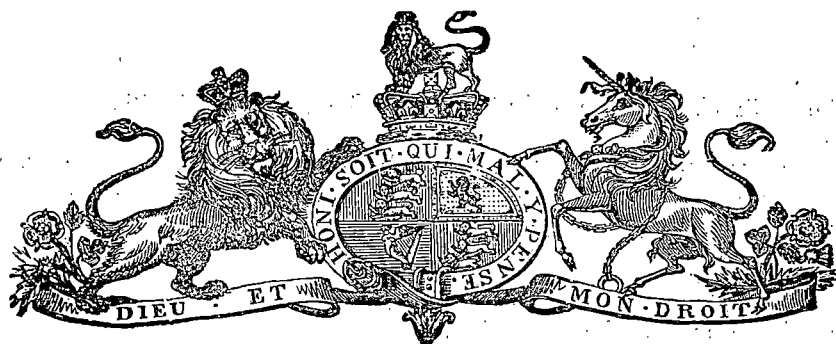

## PROGRESS REPORT.

*To His Excellency SIR FRANCIS SMITH, KNT., Administrator  
of the Government of Tasmania.*

THE Commissioners appointed by His Excellency the Governor on the 8th March, 1879, had the honor to make a Progress Report on the 25th September, 1879, which was laid before Parliament, and printed as a Paper of the House of Assembly.

In that Report Your Excellency's Commissioners alluded to the number and variety of the staple products of Tasmania which they had been able to collect and send to Sydney to undergo the scrutiny of competent judges, who were nominated to award the several degrees of merit to the exhibits which, in their opinion, they deserved.

The Sydney International Exhibition closed on the 17th September, 1879; and on the 24th August, 1880, your Commissioners received the final awards to Tasmanian exhibitors, which may be summed up as follows:—

Your Commissioners feel assured that Your Excellency will be as much gratified as they have been at the successful result of this the first International Exhibition of Australia.

Despite many drawbacks,—despite apathy in quarters where it could hardly have been expected to exist,—despite irregularities which occurred in Sydney towards the close of the Exhibition, the result of the Sydney International Exhibition of 1879 has, as far as regards the material interests of Tasmania, been a decided success, and, to use the words of the Hon. P. A. Jennings, C.M.G., the Honorary Executive Commissioner for Tasmania in Sydney, "Tasmania has more than held her own; and the number of prizes, particularly in the pastoral classes, are greater than in any of the other Colonies. The demand existing for the fine-wool sheep of Tasmania in this country (New South Wales) has been much stimulated by the unparalleled excellence of the exhibits; and New South Wales will, no doubt, for a long time to come continue to recruit her flocks by annual importations of the best strains of the Tasmanian merinos. It may be also expected that every other branch of commercial intercourse will be strengthened and enlarged, and that much benefit will accrue to both Colonies from the impetus given to trade by means of the Exhibition. The attention of France, Germany, Austria, and Belgium has also been drawn to the raw products of Tasmania; and as these countries, as well as the United States, are now competing actively for a direct trade with Australia, it may be confidently assumed that a fair share of the prosperity which would follow on the increase and development of our natural resources would fall to the lot of Tasmania."

To these remarks of one so competent to judge as the Honorable P. A. Jennings your Commissioners desire to call Your Excellency's especial attention, because on all points they feel a pleasure in being able to support them.

They agree with Mr. Jennings that the effect will be to attract such attention to Tasmania in other countries as must be beneficial to it.

It may not be uninteresting to Your Excellency to annex to this Report a Table (B), showing the result of all the Exhibitions in which our Colony has taken part during the last 29 years. The figures show that with one exception (1862) there is satisfactory proof of our products having been submitted to the World's criticism with unvarying success, and with economy in their management.

The prizes taken in 1879, as compared with the number of exhibits, is beyond anything yet recorded in our Exhibitions.

In the Appendix C. will be seen the financial position of the Exhibition.

Your Excellency is aware that a sum of £2000 was first proposed by the Executive Government to be appropriated for the purpose, but which was reduced by Parliament to one-half that amount. Owing to the *laches* of an Officer of the Exhibition in Sydney, and the large expenditure there, exceeding your Commissioners' estimate by £373, this latter sum has been found insufficient by £525, which your Commissioners trust Your Excellency will see the desirability of proposing to Parliament as an additional vote, and thereby relieve your Commissioners from the position of being unable to close the accounts of the Exhibition.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor, by direction, to hand over to you the Certificates and Medals for Tasmania. I enclose a list of the names of those connected with the Tasmanian Court, either as Commissioners or Exhibitors, to whom Diplomas and Medals have been awarded by the Commissioner of the Sydney International Exhibition.

The whole number of Certificates is 162, of which 27 (the names being marked with an asterisk \* on list) are given for services and 135 to exhibitors.

Amongst the Certificates will be found four which declare champion prizes in favour of the following exhibitors:—

Two to Messrs. W. Gibson & Son for Wool.

One to Mr. James Gibson for best Ram.

One to Mr. David Taylor for best Ewe.

The number of Medals is 129, being less than that of the Certificates, as only one of the former can be given to any one exhibitor, notwithstanding the many awards he may have obtained. The Medal is, as you are aware, looked upon rather as a compliment than as a prize conferred, while the Certificate being the more important instrument is especially held to declare the merit of the exhibitor.

There are three Gold Medals, of which one goes to each of the winners of the champion prizes.

There are 32 Silver Medals, of which 27 are conferred for official services, and 5 on the following exhibitors:—
