



MR. EDWARD ABBOTT.

REPORT OF THE SELECT COMMITTEE ON HIS CLAIM TO COMPENSATION FOR THE LOSS OF **210** ACRES OF LAND AT LAUNCESTON.

Brought up by Mr. Meredith, and ordered by the House to be printed, 5 June, 1857.



The Committee appointed to enquire as to the amount of Compensation to be awarded to Mr. Abbott for the loss of 210 acres of Land at Launceston have the honour to report, that evidence in addition to that which they have already taken is, in their opinion, indispensably requisite to enable them to arrive at a proper conclusion; and that, as such evidence could more satisfactorily be obtained in Launceston, they would recommend that the Governor be requested to constitute the Members of the Committee a Commission with power to proceed to Launceston during the Recess, for the purpose of obtaining such further evidence as they may deem necessary.
