



MARKET ACT.

PETITION FROM CLARENCE.

Presented by Mr. Lewis, and ordered by the House to be printed, September 2, 1868.



To the Honorable the Speaker and the Members of the House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled.

The Petition of the Warden, Councillors, and Municipal Electors of the Municipality of Clarence.

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

That the Act for the Regulation of the Markets, 5 Wm. No. 9, passed on the 4th September, 1834, is detrimental to the interests of your Petitioners and hurtful to Commerce.

That a Market for the sale of Colonial Produce should be established and called into existence, or that the Fees exacted by the Market Regulations should be rescinded.

Your Petitioners therefore pray that your Honorable House will take the premises into your consideration and afford your Petitioners redress.

And your Petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
