

Presented by Mr. Lette, 14th November, 1871; and ordered by the House to be printed.



To the Honorable the Speaker and Members of the House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled.

The undersigned, residing in the Districts of Selby and Morven, beg respectfully to bring under notice of your Honorable House the necessity of opening a Road for Conveyances from Launceston to the Black Boy by way of the White Hills and Watery Plains, by which a saving of considerable distance may be effected; and the recent discoveries of Gold in the Fingal District are daily increasing the traffic: we therefore trust this our Memorial may favourably be entertained.
