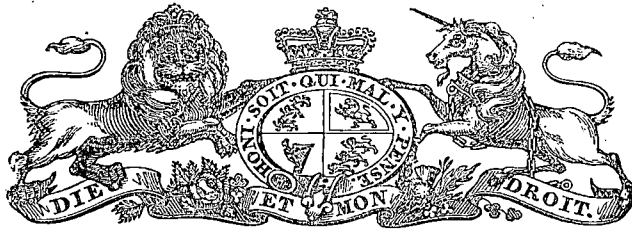


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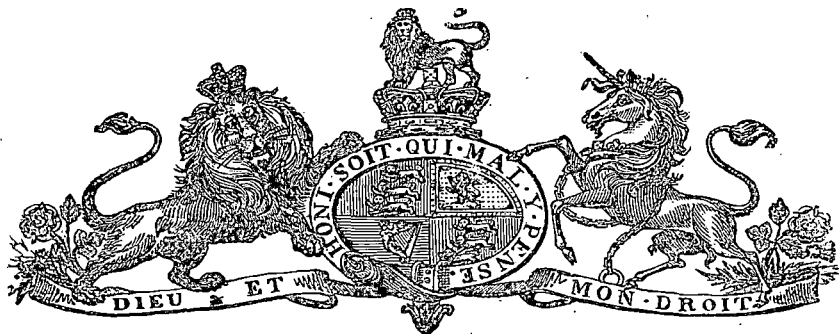

H.M. Gaol and Penal Establishment, Hobart, 15th April, 1887.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to furnish herewith the usual tabulated statistical Returns for 1886.

The net cost was £4969 18s. 4d., and the net cost per head (male division) was £34 1s. 3d., as compared with £35 8s. for 1885.

The net cost of the female division was £224 6s. 3d., and the net cost per head £7 14s. 8d., as against £12 0s. 11d. for the previous year.

The total number of prisoners on the 31st December was 125 males and 36 females, the respective numbers in 1885 being 123 and 28.

The daily average of males was 123, and females 30, as against 111 and 24 respectively in 1885.

The number of prisoners convicted at Supreme Courts was 32, being an increase of eight as compared with 1885; and the convictions from Police Courts were 138 in excess of that year.

One female and four male prisoners died during the year, the average age of whom was 73 years.

The number of prisoners under medical treatment during the year was very large, and the daily average of non-effectives was 14.

One prisoner escaped from the Domain, but was recaptured by the police.

The general conduct of the prisoners has, with few exceptions, been satisfactory.

Advantage has been taken, when possible, to reduce the cost of the Establishment by employing prisoners at remunerative work, and allowing a vacancy caused by the death of an overseer to effect a permanent reduction in the strength of the staff.

I have much pleasure in reporting favourably on the conduct and efficiency of the officers and other officials during the year.

REPORT for the Year 1886.

Penal Establishment, Launceston, 19th January, 1887.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to forward herewith the Annual Returns for the year 1886, and in doing so I beg to observe,—

1st.—There were 67 prisoners (male and female) remaining on 1st January. 743 were received during the year. The daily average strength for the year was 72·03, as against 60·59 for 1885, being an increase of 11·44.

2nd.—In the Supreme Court the convictions were 16, and discharges 17, the same as in previous year.

3rd.—The cost per head net of male and female prisoners is £28 10s. 10d., being a decrease of £11 4s. 1d. as compared with 1885. This is caused chiefly through the items “fuel and light” and “water” being transferred to Public Buildings Account.

4th.—17 male and 1 female prisoners sentenced at Superior Courts, and 11 at Inferior, were transferred to Hobart to undergo their sentences.

5th.—The junior clerk and one constable resigned during the year.

6th.—The officers have performed their duties to my entire satisfaction.

7th.—The conduct of the prisoners has been very good.
