PETITION FROM MORVEN AND SELBY.

Presented by Mr. Lette, July 16, 1872; and ordered by the House to be printed.



To the Honorable the Speaker and Members of the House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled.

THE undersigned Residents of Selby and Morven again beg respectfully to bring under notice of your Honorable House the necessity of opening a Road for Conveyances from Launceston to the Black Boy by way of the White Hills and Watery Plains, thereby saving a considerable distance,—the continued increasing population and traffic rendering it necessary that this work should be no longer delayed.
