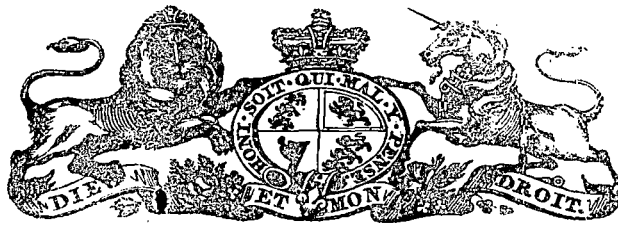

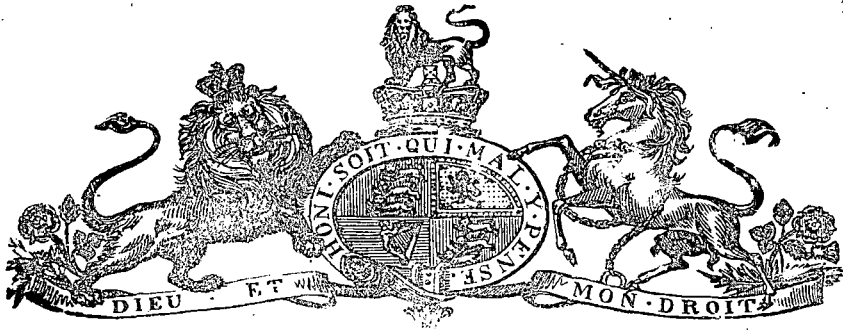

RAILWAY COMMUNICATION :

PETITION FROM THE MAYOR OF LAUNCESTON.

Presented by Mr. Aikenhead, September 18; and ordered by the Council to be printed, September 20, 1883.



*To the Honorable the President and Members of the Legislative Council of
Parliament of Tasmania.*

The humble Petition of the undersigned,

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH :

THAT a Public Meeting was held in the Town Hall, Launceston, on Monday, the 3rd instant.

That your Petitioner was requested to embody, in the form of a Petition to your Honorable House, certain Resolutions passed thereat, and sign the same on behalf of the Meeting.

The following are the Resolutions referred to :—

“That this Meeting is of opinion that it is desirable that there should be an immediate extension of Railway communication.”

“That this Meeting pledges itself to support the Government in their proposed Railway policy.”

That, in accordance with the wish of the Meeting, your Petitioner begs that your Honorable House will take such steps as may be deemed best to further the views expressed in the said Resolutions.

And your Petitioner, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
