

Electric Telegraph Department, 26th April, 1882.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to furnish Returns showing the business of the Electric Telegraph Department for the year ending 31st December, 1881.

As compared with 1880 the Returns submitted herewith show that the paid business of the Department for the year 1881 has increased in the following manner:—

Giving an increase for the year 1881 of 33,297 messages, and £2553 11s. 11d. receipts.

New lines have been erected during the year from Launceston to Beaconsfield (27 miles), Latrobe to Sheffield (15 miles), Launceston to St. Leonard's (5 miles), and Sorell to Copping (14 miles). Offices have been opened at Beaconsfield, Sheffield, St. Leonard's (Telephone), and Copping (5th January, 1882).

I have visited the majority of the Stations during the past year, and the instruments, &c. are all in good order. I desire to bear testimony to the manner in which the officers of the Department generally have endeavoured to carry out their duties.

No disadvantage has arisen from the use of the Telephone for the transmission of ordinary messages between Launceston and St. Leonard's, and those in use in Hobart continue to work well and give satisfaction. Communication has also lately been successfully established between Hobart and Pearson's Point, a distance of 19 miles, having in the same circuit the Marine Board Office and the Signal Stations at Battery Point and Mount Nelson. I strongly urge the Government to provide the necessary facilities for this mode of communication, both by the establishment of a telephone exchange and the erection of private lines under the conditions suggested and set forth in my Report dated the 21st February, 1882, and I am fully persuaded the public would quickly avail themselves of the convenience so afforded.

There has been no interruption of telegraphic communication with Victoria by means of the Submarine Cable. The policy of reduction of the cable rates commends itself to the general public, as shown in the fact that, in the first three months of 1882 during which the reduced rates have been in operation, the receipts were £2244 14s. 3d., as against £1723 16s. 7d. for the like period of 1881; and I anticipate that the results of a twelve months' trial will be found so satisfactory, and the receipts so much beyond what was estimated, that the Government will find it desirable to reconsider the amount of subsidy (£1200 per annum) now paid to the Submarine Cable Company.

The increase in the local traffic is highly gratifying, and although more apparent in the two principal offices, Hobart and Launceston, together with those situated in the mining districts, is yet pretty general throughout the island, and may be taken as an evidence of prosperity, and also that telegraphic communication is becoming more universal every day.

A comparative statement for the last seven years is furnished, showing that, while in that period the number of Telegraph Stations have been little more than doubled, the receipts are nearly quadrupled. The receipts from cable business have remained pretty steady during the past six years, but a considerable increase may be anticipated in 1882 owing to the reduced rates.

Although far from satisfactory, there has yet been a vast improvement in the working of the lines as compared with previous years; and now that a competent inspector has been appointed to superintend the work of the contractors for maintenance, I have every reason to believe that before long the several lines throughout the Colony will be in satisfactory order.

The north-eastern extension from Launceston, *via* Lefroy, to Gladstone, Moorina, and Upper Ringarooma, is in progress, and arrangements are nearly completed for commencing the erection of the line from Waratah to Macquarie Harbour, *via* Coriuna and Mount Heemskirk.

In connection with the north-eastern extension there is being erected a second wire from Lefroy to Low Head. This will give an independent wire for Intercolonial business, and also furnish an alternative means of communication with Low Head or Lefroy should either wire become disabled.

Duplex instruments have been received from England, and successfully worked between Hobart and Launceston; but even with their use another through wire has become an absolute necessity. There are now two wires between Hobart and Launceston, one of which is principally occupied with the business from intermediate stations and branch lines, which renders it unsuitable for duplex working, added to which the extent of business passing over this line is such as to preclude its use for Intercolonial work. The other wire is fully occupied with Intercolonial work and business between Hobart and Launceston, which makes it difficult to use duplex instruments to advantage. I therefore strongly recommend the erection of a third wire between Hobart and Launceston, which I propose to work with the duplex instruments, and use for the business of those stations alone. This would then give an independent wire from Hobart to Low Head for Intercolonial messages, and a separate wire for the intermediate stations and branch lines, and would materially lessen the unavoidable delays which often take place through the overcrowding of the wires. Of its necessity I have no doubt, and the rapid increase of business warrants me in saying that the additional wire, even when duplexed, will give no more accommodation than will be found actually necessary. I would further recommend its erection along the Main Line of Railway, as giving greater security from interruption, and being easier of access for repairs; and I have no doubt satisfactory arrangements could be made with the Manager of the Tasmanian Main Line of Railway Company for its erection and maintenance.

During the year 78 steamers, 22 barques, and 82 schooners and coasting vessels have been reported as passing the station at Falmouth.

The removal of the Launceston office to more suitable and commodious quarters has lately been effected; and the alterations, when complete, will prove a boon to the officers employed therein, as well as an extended convenience to the public, and are likely to meet the requirements for some years to come.

I trust the day is not far distant when the Hobart office will be placed on a better footing as regards accommodation. At present it is totally inadequate and insufficient for the staff employed; and, with the rapid increase of business that has taken place within the last few years, it becomes a necessity that extended and suitable accommodation be afforded, otherwise it will almost be an impossibility to carry out the work of the Department in a proper and efficient manner.
