

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

RAILWAY TERMINUS, LATROBE:

PETITION.

Presented by Mr. Moore, August 26; and ordered by the Council to be printed, September 1, 1881.



To the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council, in Parliament assembled.

The humble Petition of the Residents of Latrobe and the surrounding Districts,

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

That your Petitioners are desirous that the proposed Railway from Deloraine to Latrobe should be extended from the present terminus at Latrobe to the shipping-place at the Ballast Ground, deep water, which will facilitate the shipment of produce, and thus make the Line more likely to be remunerative by increasing the traffic.

That the amount proposed by Parliament, and voted by the House of Assembly, for the extension of the Line from Deloraine to Latrobe (namely £100,000), is ample to provide for this additional extension of $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

Your Petitioners therefore pray that your Honorable House will take the necessary steps to have this work carried out.

And, as in duty bound, your Petitioners will ever pray, &c.
