Electoral Amendment (Integrity of Elections) Bill 2021

The Electoral Amendment (Integrity of Elections) Bill 2021 amends the Electoral Act 2004 to introduce a significant range of electoral reforms. The bill would –

- Set a cap of \$3,000, on aggregate political donations from the same source, per electoral term.
- Only allow political donations to be made by 'natural persons' (I.e. not corporations or organisations) who are citizens or permanent residents.
- Set the donation disclosure threshold to \$1,000.
- Introduce a real-time disclosure framework, requiring donation disclosures 7 business days after receipt, and within 24 hours during the 7 days before election polling day.
- Provide an expenditure cap for Assembly elections of \$82,000 for individual candidates and third parties, as well as \$820,000 for political parties, in 2021, indexed by \$1,000 and \$10,000 respectively per year.
- Introduce public funding for election campaigns, set at the Commonwealth public funding rate (currently \$2.871 per first preference vote).
- Regulate third-parties on similar terms to candidates and parties.
- Introduce 'truth in political advertising' laws.
- Abolish the general prohibition on using a candidate's name and replacing it
 with targeted prohibitions on use of a candidate's name in s misleading or
 deceptive manner.
