You will see that, in addition to the copies forwarded officially, we receive copies in certain cases direct from the Government Printing Office, Hobart. These latter are forwarded under cover of a wrapper addressed to "The Secretary of State for the Colonies". (I may say, in passing, that the direct channel is used by the Government Printers in some of the other States.)

The total number of the copies of the documents in question received from Tasmania is really in excess of our requirements, and, while we do not wish to suggest officially an alteration to an arrangement which has existed for many years, it would be quite convenient to us if the total number received were reduced to 3 in each case. The figure given in the note sent to Sir Ernest Clark to which you refer, except in the case of Acts, of which we should be glad to receive 7 copies (1 sealed copy and 6 plain copies) These figures are included in the fourth column of the enclosed note to facilitate reference.
