I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 4th instant, regarding the origin of the appointment of the Honourable James Whyte as Chief Inspector of Stock.

In reply I desire to state that I have taken the following extract from "The Mercury" of August 22, 1882, which I trust will give you the necessary information in regard to this matter :-

"After much opposition the Hon. James Whyte successfully carried the Stock Act, 35 Vict. No. 22 on the 22nd October, 1869. The interest he took in the question was so great, that the Government of the day begged him to accept the office of Chief Inspector, in order that it might be effectually carried out. Mr. Whyte has ever since held that office. The original act, through his instrumentality, has been repealed and its provisions modified by the Acts 41 Vict. No. 8 and 42 Vict. No. 15. The Honourable Mr. Whyte was, at first strongly opposed in his endeavours to eradicate scab in sheep; but his bitterest opponents soon saw he was their best friend, and many of the largest sheep owners recognized his services in a substantial manner. If in politics the late Mr. Whyte failed, in scab eradication he accomplished a great work, which will always cause his name to be honoured not only throughout Tasmania, but Australia, in whose conferences he has taken part, etc."
