3. The Department of Health provides accommodation support to eligible health staff, including newly recruited staff from interstate and overseas, rotating medical registrars, senior clinical staff, health executives and agency staff. This accommodation support can be in the form of hotel-style accommodation, short or longer-term accommodation in Crown-owned or leased properties, or financial allowances to support health staff to finance their own sourced accommodation.

As part of Health Workforce 2040 strategy (Action 5.08), a review of the policy and processes around health staff accommodation has commenced with a view to provide accommodation support more efficiently and economically, while supporting the service delivery requirements of the Department.

This project is in line with work already being undertaken by Infrastructure, as part of the Department's Residential Accommodation Reform Project to implement centralised governance to improve and standardise the management of residential leases.

The Department has also contributed to consultation with Homes Tasmania in their development of the Tasmanian Housing Strategy Action Plan, to assist in developing a framework for key worker rental accommodation.

The Tasmanian Government has partnered with the Australian Government on the Macquarie Point Urban Renewal project. In consultation with key stakeholders and the community, we are now creating a refreshed precinct plan, which will include affordable housing for key workers to support health services.

The Tasmanian Government is establishing Regional Strategic Partnerships around Tasmania that will include a focus on building more homes and having essential services and supports in line with regional needs.

The first of these partnerships was with the West Coast Regional Council with the Memorandum of Understanding signed on 25 August 2023.
