



No receipts in excess of £50 are reckoned in the calculations. The deduction of 7s. 2d. in the £ is made in every case. The calculation on the basis adopted came to £701 19s. 8d. The excess of £1 19s. 8d. was provided for by deducting one shilling from each of the above 39 Libraries; and also one penny, in addition to the shilling, from each of the under-mentioned Libraries, namely—Campbell Town, Deloraine, Latrobe, Longford, New Norfolk, Oatlands, Scottsdale, and Westbury.
