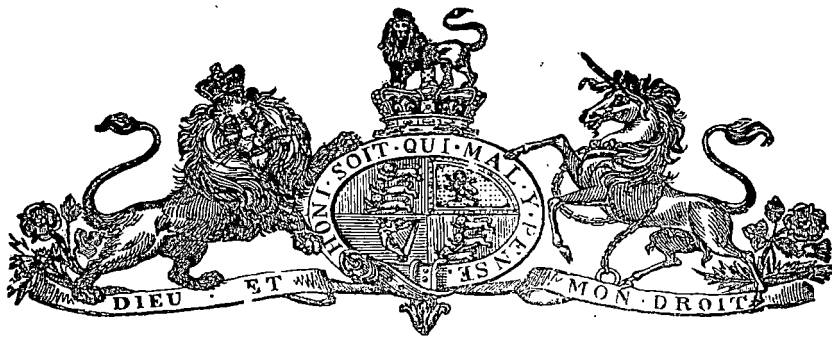

REPORT for 1886.

Hobart, 21st February, 1887.

SIR,

THE Ladies' Committee of the Girls' Training School Reformatory are glad to report that the work of the Institution has gone on quietly and steadily throughout the past year.

The Institution continues to be self-supporting, and has now a sum of £288 8s. 1d. towards a building or reserve fund.

The average number of inmates for the year has been ten, and their behaviour on the whole good. Four girls were admitted during the year, and two left for situations.

The girls are employed in washing, housework, cooking, and needlework; and receive Bible lessons and instruction in reading, writing, and arithmetic.

The amount earned during the year by washing is £329 17s. 4d.

The Committee desire again to record their appreciation of the Matron's untiring energy and devotion, which so materially help towards the success of the Institution.
