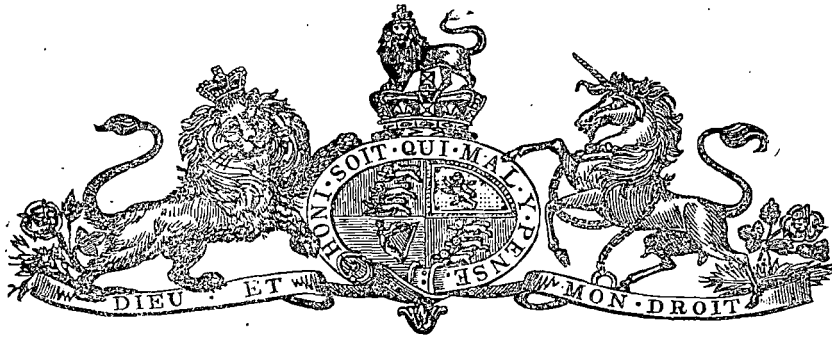

Hobart, 10th February, 1894.

SIR,

THE Ladies' Committee of the Girls' Training School Reformatory, in presenting their Thirteenth Annual Report, are pleased to state that the work of the Institution has gone on steadily throughout the year.

The Institution has in some measure felt the depression, but still has the sum of £113 9s. 7d. towards a reserve fund.

At the beginning of the year there were thirteen girls; during the year two were received and five left the Institution. Five of these are voluntary inmates. Their behaviour on the whole has been good. A short service is held on Sunday morning, and classes by ladies for Bible instruction on Saturday evenings and Sunday afternoons.

The girls are employed in washing, housework, cooking, needlework, and receive instruction in reading, writing, and arithmetic.

The amount received by washing during the year was £269 16s. 10d.

The Committee again record their appreciation of the energy and zeal of the Matrons, which help so much towards the success of the Institution.

REPORT on the Annual Examination, December 13, 1893.

TWELVE Girls were examined, nine of whom had been present at the previous yearly examination. The progress of two was found to have been good; that of three fair, that of two moderate, while two had made very little progress.

In reading and writing satisfactory progress has been general, and in arithmetic there is a noticeable improvement. The results on the whole were very fair.
