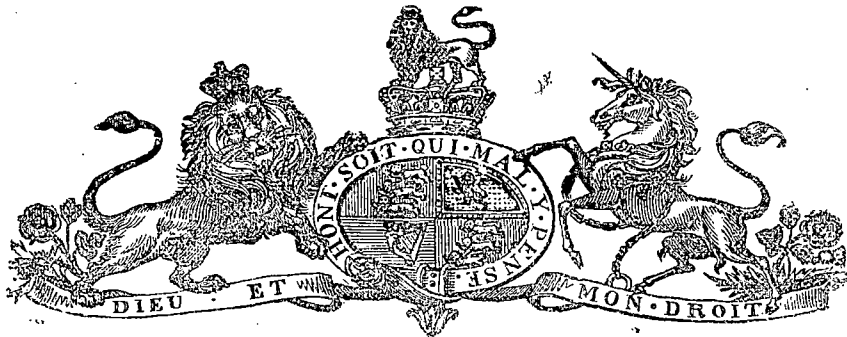

BOARD OF IMMIGRATION.

REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1884.

Immigration Office, Hobart, 1st May, 1885.

SIR,

1. THE Board of Immigration have the honor to forward their Annual Report for the year ended 31st December, 1884.
2. During the year 949 Immigrants arrived under the "Assisted Passage System" (including 399 children), being an increase of 351 persons as compared with the year 1883.
3. The number of "Assisted Passage Certificates" issued by the Board during 1884 was 443; viz.—193 family, 157 single males, and 143 single females. Certificates were unused; viz.—24 family, 35 single males, and 35 single females, equal to 135½ statute adults. The amounts paid for these unused certificates was £263 10s.
4. The London Agents of the Board issued 243 "Assisted Passage Certificates" during the year; viz.—87 family, 100 single males, and 56 single females.
5. The amount paid for Assisted Passage Certificates was £1864 10s., and the sum of £256 was refunded on account of unused Certificates.
6. Land Certificates under the 7th Section of the Act 31 Vict. No. 26 were granted to 124 individuals, entitling them to select 5690 acres of land. These Certificates represent 110 male and 62 female adults, and 106 children,—a total of 278 souls.
7. "Land Orders" under the 5th Section of the same Act were issued, the total nominal value of such Orders being £4474. These "Land Orders" represent 147 adults, and 199 children under 15 years of age.
8. The balance at the disposal of the Board on 31st December, 1884, amounted to £7273 12s. 6d., including unsold debentures under Act 19th Vict. No. 18 to the amount of £2900. The obligations undertaken by the Board under Passage Certificates issued (see par. 3), and in reference to Immigration from Germany (see par. 10), will exhaust the available balance, and may occasion the amount voted to be exceeded.
9. Returns obtained from the various Municipal Police Districts of the Colony would seem to show that most of the Immigrants who have arrived under the auspices of the Board are doing well and giving satisfaction to their employers. Many have purchased Passage Certificates to bring out their friends, and others are anxious to do so. A few have found their way to other Colonies, and the Board think it desirable that, in any future legislation on the subject of Immigration, their officers should be empowered to prevent the departure of persons who have been brought out at the expense of the country, until they have defrayed such portion of their passage money as is provided for by their agreements.

10. Owing to the number of German settlers desirous of bringing out their friends, and the general success which has attended this class of Immigration, the Board in September last made arrangements with Mr. Frederick Buck,—formerly German Immigration Agent,—to select and forward from Germany Emigrants equal to one hundred statute adults. Mr. Buck left Hobart in October, his intention being to despatch the Emigrants as soon after Christmas as possible so that they might reach Tasmania in time for the harvest of 1885.

11. The Board call attention to the recommendations contained in their Report for 1883 (Paper 135, Parliamentary Papers, 1884), which they trust will receive attention in any proposed legislation submitted to Parliament.

12. Mr. L. R. Castray having resigned the position of Secretary to the Board and Immigration Agent, His Excellency the Governor, on the recommendation of the Board, appointed Mr. Thos. C. Just to occupy those positions, the appointment taking effect from 16th June.

13. The usual Returns for the year 1884 are appended, five relating to the operations of the Board under the Acts of Parliament 31 Vict. No. 26, and 38 Vict. No. 16, and two showing the liabilities of the Government and the Board on overdue "Bounty Tickets;" also the Cash Accounts of the Board, with Digests of the Expenditure in England and Tasmania.

14. A statement is also appended showing the acreage selected and purchased by the holders of "Land Certificates" and "Land Orders" during the year 1884.
