

## REPORT for 1887.

Invalid Depót, Launceston, 21st February, 1888.

I HAVE the honor to submit my Annual Report for this Establishment for the year 1887.

Admissions.—The admissions were 60 in excess of the previous year (males); and, although 24 beds have been added during the year, the accommodation is still insufficient; consequently, it has been decided to erect another ward which will accommodate 32 men. From 1st January, 1887, the female paupers, who were formerly chargeable to the Penal Establishment, have been taken on the strength of the Invalid Depôt, and a female nurse engaged at a salary of £30 per annum, with quarters and rations. The daily average number of inmates was—males, 128 68; females, 20:40; of which 145:66 were chargeable to the Colonial Government, and 3:42 to the Imperial Government. The daily average for 1886 was—males, 128; females, 21.

Discharges.—15 were transferred to General Hospital and other Institutions, 6 to the police for breaches of the regulations, 8 absconded, 45 were discharged by the approval of the Administrator of Charitable Grants, 13 were let out on pass, 53 were discharged at their own request, 38 died.

Mortality.—The death-rate was 12.40 per cent., as against 10.34 per cent. for 1886. The average age at death was 73.04; the maximum being 90, and the minimum 39 years. The united ages of the 13 oldest who died were 1079, being an average of 83 years.

Ages.—The average ages of inmates was—Males, 67.08; females, 62.41.

The gross expenditure for the year was £2050 5s.  $11\frac{1}{2}d$ . The annual cost per head was £13 15s.  $0\frac{3}{4}d$ , and £13 7s. 2d. on gross and net expenditure respectively, as against £14 3s.  $9\frac{1}{4}d$ . and £13 12s.  $8\frac{1}{2}d$ . for 1886.

*Remarks.*—The conduct of the inmates has been satisfactory. Appended are Returns of Expenditure, Contract Prices, and Decennial Returns.
