



REPORT of the CAMPBELL TOWN HOSPITAL, 1883.

Campbell Town, 23rd January, 1884.

Sir.

WE have the honor to forward the Annual Report of the Campbell Town Hospital for 1883.

The Trustees of the Campbell Town Hospital have pleasure in again reporting upon the very satisfactory state of the finances. They wish they could say as much of the building, which, as before stated, does not meet present requirements, eight would-be patients having been refused admittance during the year from want of accommodation.

- 2. The subscribers are aware that a Petition embodying these circumstances, and asking for a grant-in-aid towards the erection of a new Hospital, was submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council about May last, but up to this date no acknowledgment of said Petition has been received.
- 3. The number of patients admitted during the year (60) was in excess of any year since 1877, and we may expect that during the construction of the Fingal Railway many cases of accident admitted here will tend to swell our yearly average considerably.
- 4. Of 60 cases admitted, 6 have died, 4 remain for treatment, and 50 were discharged. There were 275 out-patients.
- 5. Average cost of each in-door patient per year on nett expenditure, £1 17s. 9d. We believe this item will compare favourably with the cost of patients in either the Hobart or Launceston Hospitals.
- 6. Our thanks are due to the Clergy and others who have taken an interest in the Hospital during the past year. Doctor Lever's services have been most constant and valuable; and Dr. Naylor has very kindly given his services gratuitously.
