



ILFRACOMBE SAW MILLS.

REPORT OF THE SELECT COMMITTEE.

Presented by Mr. Gunn, and ordered by the House to be printed, 2 April, 1857.



The Select Committee of the House of Assembly to whom the Bill, entitled "A Bill to simplify Civil Proceedings by and against, and to regulate Criminal Proceedings by, 'The Ilfracombe Saw Mills and Railway Company,' and to enable the said Company to construct Railways or Tramroads, Wharves, Piers, and Jetties," was referred on the 26th day of March, 1857, have agreed to the following

REPORT.

Your Committee, having examined the Deed of Settlement referred to in the Preamble of the Bill, and having taken evidence in support of the allegations contained in the Preamble, have the honor to report that the Preamble of the Bill has been proved to the satisfaction of your Committee.

Your Committee, having agreed that the Preamble should stand part of the Bill, then entered upon the consideration of its several Clauses and Schedules; and agreed upon the several amendments therein, which are shown on the printed copy of the Bill signed by the Chairman of your Committee, and hereto annexed.

Your Committee, therefore, would recommend the Bill thus amended to the favourable consideration of your Honourable House.
