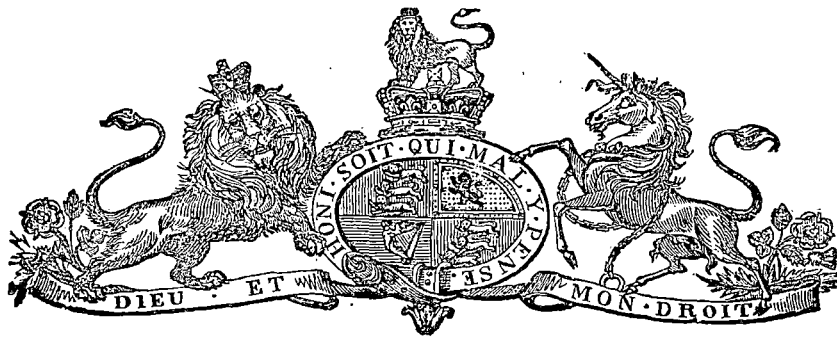
MINUTE No. 317.
