
PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

REPORT OF ENGINEER-IN-CHIEF AS TO COST OF ALTERATIONS OF RAILS FROM LIGHT TO HEAVY.

Return to an Order of the House of Assembly. (Mr. Sutton.)

"12. Ordered, That the Report of the Engineer-in-Chief as to the cost of alterations of rails from light to heavy on the Chudleigh Railway be laid on the Table of the House. (Mr. Sutton.)"

The Engineer-in-Chief made no special report. The cost of the alteration was £2300, viz., for 43lb. rails in lieu of 30lb. rails. See Appendix, page vii. of Parliamentary Paper No. 66, Session 1886.
