

ANNUAL REPORT for 1870.

THE Board of Management of the Launceston General Hospital have the honor to lay before the Government their Report for the year 1870.

The number of Patients treated is somewhat less than last year.

The average daily cost for each Patient is slightly higher this year than last, in consequence of the great decrease in the amount received from Paying Patients.

With deep regret the Board have to record the death during the past year of one of their Members, namely, John Crookes, Esq., Chairman of the Board of Management.

The Board have much pleasure in here recording their appreciation of the gratuitous services of the honorary consulting Surgeons, Drs. Miller and Wigan. On all occasions where their services were required they were given with the greatest promptitude; and the Surgeon-Superintendent has, in many instances, been indebted to them for most valuable assistance.

REPORT of the Surgeon-Superintendent of the Launceston General Hospital for the Year 1870.

During the year 1870 there were admitted into the Hospital 323 Patients, of whom 250 were males, and 73 females.

There remained under treatment at the close of 1869, 52 Patients; so that the total number treated during the year was 375: of these 251 were discharged cured or relieved, 64 died, and 60 remained under treatment at the commencement of 1870.

Of the total number of deaths, 28 occurred within 8 days after admission; viz.—7 on the 1st day, 6 on the 2nd, 1 on the 4th, 1 on the 5th, 6 on the 6th, and 7 on the 7th.

The ages of those who died were as follows:--

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Of the Patients admitted 50 were Self-supporting, 7 were wholly or in part chargeable to Imperial Funds, and 316 were Colonial Paupers.

The sum of £114 0s. 2d. was received for Self-supporting Patients during the year.

The average daily number of Patients during the year was 682, and the cost per head nearly 1s. 11d.
