

The humble Petition of the undersigned Inhabitants of the City of Hobart Town.

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH :

1.....

THAT, in the opinion of your Petitioners, it is highly desirable that places and means of recreation, amusement, and healthful exercise should be provided for the Inhabitants of Hobart Town generally, and more especially for the Working Classes.

That your Petitioners believe that the Government Domain is suitable to such purposes; and your Petitioners are therefore desirous that the same may be secured in such manner as may effect the object of your Petitioners.

Your Petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Honourable House will be pleased to recommend that the Government Domain may be vested in the City Corporation exclusively and inalienably for the use, recreation, amusement, and healthful exercise of the Inhabitants of Hobart Town.
