

No. 1. Particulars of Expenditure of £5000 voted for the purpose of opening up Roads and constructing Bridges between the Rivers Mersey and Leven in the County of Devon :—

No. 2. A Contract has been entered into for opening up 18 miles of the Road (30 feet wide) between the Rivers Mersey and Leven, at a cost of $\pounds 452$: the work is nearly completed. A Road from the end of Kentish's Track to Kimberley's Ford is finished, at a cost of $\pounds 15$.

Improving Kimberley's Ford (nearly finished), £96.

In consequence of the difficulty experienced in reference to the construction of a Bridge over the Mersey where Kentish's Tract was designed to cross it, it has been found necessary to cross the Mersey at Kimberley's Ford, which is three quarters of a mile lower down the river, and which has caused the expenditure of the above two items.
