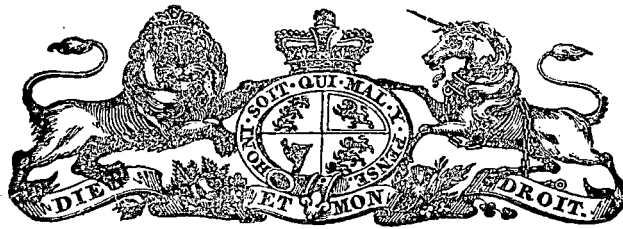

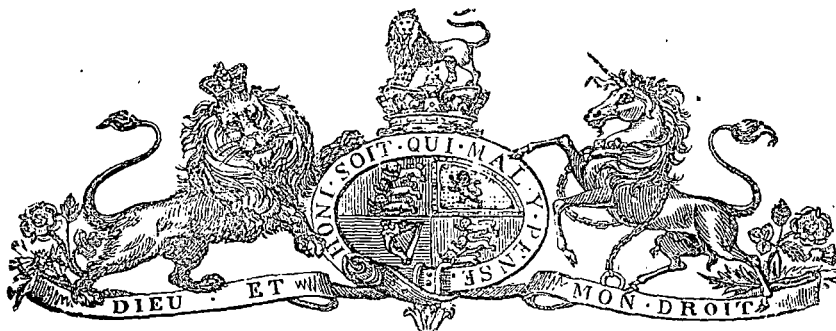

ANNUAL REPORT of the TASMANIAN COUNCIL OF EDUCATION for the Year 1873-74.

To His Excellency CHARLES DU CANE, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

1. In conformity with the provisions of "The Tasmanian Council of Education and Scholarship Act," we have the honor to submit this our Fourteenth Report embracing the proceedings of the Council between the 1st May, 1873, and the 30th April, 1874. 22 Vict. No. 21, Section 30.

2. His Honor Mr. Justice Dobson was re-elected President for the year ending 30th June, 1874. President.

3. We caused an Examination of Candidates for the Council of Education Exhibitions to be held in the month of June, 1873. Fourteen Students presented themselves for examination; and, on the recommendation of the Examiners, Exhibitions of the value of £20 each were awarded to Francis William Streanshalh Allison, pupil of Mr. R. Leach, Launceston, and John George Lindsay, pupil of Rev. W. H. Savigny, M.A., Church Grammar School, Launceston. Of the remaining twelve, seven obtained a standard of marks sufficient to entitle them to an Exhibition, and five were entitled to the honorable mention of their names. Council of Education Exhibitions, Gazette Notice, 24 June, 1873.

The Examiners in closing their Report on the Examination observe:—

"The results of the Examination will bear favourable comparison with those of former years. A larger number of boys than last year or the year previous offered themselves for examination, and more Schools are represented. We also observe with satisfaction that six of the competitors have already been distinguished at former public Examinations, having been awarded Exhibitions by the Board of Education, and that four of these are the four first in the annexed Table. The Candidates generally have acquitted themselves very well; and several others, besides the two recommended for Exhibitions, have shown proofs of great industry, perseverance, and careful training, as well as of good natural ability."

4. The Fourteenth Examination for the Degree of Associate of Arts was held in September, 1873; M. H. Irving, Esq., M.A., Head Master of Wesley College, Melbourne, being the Examiner in English, Latin, Greek, French, Pure Mathematics, and Natural Philosophy; the Rev. R. D. Poulett Harris, M.A., Examiner in German; H. M. Andrew, Esq., M.A., Examiner in Chemistry; and J. Summers, Esq., Mus. Bac., Examiner in Music. Fourteen Candidates, including two Females, presented themselves; twelve passed the Preliminary Examination and ten succeeded in obtaining the Degree, four being placed in the First Class, one in the Second Class, and five, including one Female, in the Third Class. One of the successful Candidates was examined at Launceston under supervision sanctioned by the Council. Degree of A.A., Gazette Notice, 30 September, 1873.

5. Two other Candidates, one Male and one Female, obtained a second Class, but being above the age of 19 years were included in a Special List. Special Class List, Degree of A.A.

6. Arthur Pitcairn Canaway, as the Senior Associate of the year, received the Council's Gold Medal, a First Prize of the value of £10 for English, Prizes of the value of £5 each for Natural Philosophy and Chemistry, and Second Prizes of the value of £5 each for Latin, Greek, French, and Mathematics. To Alfred Doran, who was placed in the First Class, were awarded three First Prizes of the value of £10 each

in Latin, Greek, and French. To Charles James Pike, who was also placed in the First Class, was awarded the First Prize of the value of £10 for Mathematics.

To Clara Martha Dowdell, who was placed in the Third Class, was awarded a Prize of the value of £5 as Senior Female Associate of the year.

The Examiners in closing their Report observe :—

On the whole, therefore, the Examination closed must be accounted satisfactory ; and the Council will, doubtless, be glad to observe that under precisely similar conditions as to papers set and the valuing of answers, two out of the three female Candidates of the year have succeeded in obtaining fair places in the Class Lists. That their standard should, for the present at least, be fixed a trifle below that for male Candidates is certainly not inequitable. It is not now lower than that with which the Associates of 1860 started : and doubtless, as now in Victoria, here also the female Candidates will soon be able to ask only ‘a fair field and no favour.’ ”

Tasmanian Scholarships, *Gazette* Notice, 30 September, 1873.

7. The Examination for Tasmanian Scholarships in September last was conducted by M. H. Irving, Esq., M.A. Five Candidates presented themselves. Two—George Wilson Waterhouse, A.A. 1871, and Charles Caleb Williamson, A.A. 1871—reached the standard prescribed by the Council. A Scholarship was awarded to each, and they have proceeded to Great Britain to enter upon their University studies.

Latin Verse Composition, *Gazette* Notice, 22 April, 1873.

8. On the recommendation of the Examiner, M. H. Irving, Esq., M.A., a Prize of Books of the value of £5 was awarded to Charles Caleb Williamson, A.A. 1871, and Tasmanian Scholar for the year 1873, for Latin Verse Composition.

Latin Prize Essay, *Gazette* Notice, 22 April, 1873.

9. For the Prize of Books of the value of £5 5s., offered through the Council for Latin Essay, on the subject “*Quantum adjumenti literarum studium ad rempublicam administrandam afferat?*” no compositions were sent in.

Gilchrist Scholarship.

10. The Second Examination for the Biennial Scholarship of £100 per annum for three years, offered by the Trustees of the Gilchrist Educational Trust to the youth of this Colony, was held in August last, and conducted under the supervision of the Council in accordance with the regulations laid down by the Home Authorities. Three Candidates presented themselves ; and the papers worked by them were forwarded under seal to the Authorities in England through Your Excellency. A communication, notifying that Mr. George Wilson Waterhouse, A.A., 1871, and Tasmanian Scholar of 1873, had been awarded the Scholarship, was received by the Council.

Dry Scholarship.

11. The Trustees of the Dry Scholarship Fund have placed at our disposal an Annual Exhibition of the value of £14, for the object of assisting the Senior Associate of Arts in each year to continue his studies, preparatory for the Examination for the Tasmanian Scholarship, provided he declares his intention to proceed with his studies and to compete for the Tasmanian Scholarship ; and, should such not be his intention, or should he relinquish his studies, then the Scholarship to be awarded to the Associate next in standing for the current year, upon the same terms. Arthur Pitcairn Canaway, Senior Associate of the year, having intimated his intention to proceed with his studies and compete for the Tasmanian Scholarship, the Dry Scholarship was awarded to him.

Local Examination for Matriculation at Melbourne University.

12. Since the publication of our last Report, three Examinations of Candidates for Matriculation at the University of Melbourne have been held in Hobart Town, under our supervision, with the following results :—

July Term, 1873—One Candidate—Failed.

October Term, 1873—One Candidate—Failed.

February Term, 1874—Two Candidates—One failed. Charles Richard Morriss passed.

13. Henry Alleine Perkins, M.B. Edinburgh, Tasmanian Scholar of 1866, and Manasseh Fearnley, B.A., Cambridge, Tasmanian Scholar of 1867, have recently returned to Tasmania. Tasmanian Scholars.

14. We have revised our Rules and Regulations and have duly obtained the approval of Your Excellency thereto, and, in accordance with the terms of the 29th Section of "The Tasmanian Council of Education and Scholarship Act," have published the same for general information in the *Hobart Town Gazette* of the 18th November, 1873. Revision of Rules, *Gazette* Notice, 18 November, 1873.

15. We have to record the resignation of the Hon. James A. Dunn. The Rev. J. R. Buckland, B.A. was elected to the seat in the Council thus vacated. Vacancy in Council.

16. We submit a Statement of the Disbursements of the Council between the 1st January and the 31st December, 1873, the termination of the financial year; together with a Supplementary Statement of Payments between the 1st January and the 30th April, 1874. The total expenditure under every head for the year 1873 is shown to have amounted to £829 15s. 11d., being £64 4s. 1d. less than the sum voted by Parliament. Financial Statement.

17. We append to our Report a Roll of the Tasmanian Scholars, a List of those Students who have obtained the Degree of Associate of Arts, and a List of those who obtained Exhibitions offered by the Council. Appendix A, B, and C.
