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

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



THE Balance Sheet and Statements of Account of the Consolidated Revenue of the Colony were examined and returned to the Treasury on the 23rd ultimo, certified in the usual manner. The examina-tion of the Municipal and Road Trust Accounts, which has been undertaken by this Department for the first time this year, has caused some delay in forwarding this letter; the examination of the Municipal Accounts having only just been completed, and a few of the Road Trusts not having yet satisfied questions raised on their accounts. I did not think it desirable to further delay my report in consequence of the latter circumstance, but will, if matters of sufficient importance should arise before completing the examination, forward a special report thereon.

showing an increase of about £10,000 over the Revenue of 1874. After deducting from the total Revenue the sum of £12,086 4s. 1d., being the amount of Reserves for redemption of Debentures raised for construction of Roads under Sections 19 and 29 of "The Waste Lands Act," the sum available for general purposes is £327,951 3s. 1d.

I regret to have to notice a defalcation on the part of the late Collector of Carriage Duties for the district of Fingal, Mr. M Comas, the amount lost to the revenue thereby being $\pounds 22$. The matter was duly reported; and on 6th April last I was informed that the Government did not intend to prosecute, as the defaulter had already received a sentence of imprisonment for a more serious embezzlement of moneys entrusted to him as Council Clerk of Fingal.

Debt of the Colony.—According to the Balance Sheet, the Debt of the Colony appears to be £1,532,500; this is the amount of Debentures known to be issued and outstanding on 31st December, 1875, and would include the Debentures redeemed in London after 30th September, 1875,—the accounts from the Consolidated Bank not reaching the Treasury till after the books were closed to 31st December. The Bank accounts have now, however, been received, and Debentures for £1800 were paid off in London during the last quarter of the year, leaving the amount of Debentures issued and outstanding at $\pounds 1,530,700$, irrespective of those authorised but not issued; but these figures would also include Deben-tures raised in advance to meet Debentures due in 1876, it being necessary to provide money to remit to London some months before the Debentures actually fall due. Excluding the latter, and adding the amount authorised but not issued, the Debt would stand as follows:—

Advance to the South Esh Bridge Trust.—I have again to call attention to the amount advanced annually to the South Esk Bridge Trustees, referred to in my Reports on the Accounts for the years 1873 and 1874; the advances now amount to £720 10s. 7d. I trust that some provision will be made by Parliament for this expenditure during the coming Session.

Marine Board Accounts.—With the exception of Circular Head the Accounts of the several Marine Boards have been duly audited. I brought the neglect of the Master Warden at Circular Head, in not forwarding his accounts, under the notice of the Government on 24th April last, but have not received any reply to my letter.

Queries and Letters unanswered .- The following Queries and Letters have not yet been fully satisfied :--

- 5. Query 421.—Accounts for Board and Lodging and Passage Money of Nurses for the General Hospital.
- 6. Query 424.-Salaries and Allowances of Department of Chief Inspector of Sheep.
- 7. Query 430.—Salary of House Cleaner, General Hospital.
- 8. Letter dated 26th May, 1875, asking for authority for Purchase of Furniture for Government House.
- 9. Letters dated 10th June, 1875, and 2nd February, 1876, referring to non-payment of amount due to Sinking Fund under the Cemeteries Act.
- 10. Letter dated 18th November, 1875, respecting unsatisfactory nature of check against payments for Out-door Relief in the Country Districts, and bringing under notice the great increase in the expenditure.
- 11. Letter dated 12th June, 1876, asking for reply to letter of 24th February, 1874, referring to Accounts furnished by the Commissioner of Escheat.

The questions raised in cases 1, 2, 6, and 9 are of sufficient importance to demand that the position of each should be clearly understood by Parliament. I therefore append the correspondence that has taken place in reference thereto.

Municipal, Road Trust, and Rabbit Trust Accounts.—Under Audit Act, No. 2, the duty of auditing the Municipal and Road Trust Accounts has been entrusted to the Audit Office; this has caused a very great addition to the work and responsibility of this Department, with very small increase to its strength, so much so that I fear it will be impossible to get through the work efficiently unless another Junior Clerk is appointed; for I find that some of the current work would have unavoidably fallen into arrear unless I had obtained the services of a volunteer from 1st January last.

The whole of the Accounts of the Municipalities, with one exception, have been audited and passed with unqualified certificates, the exception being the Municipality of Glenorchy, the accounts of which as far as the year 1875 is concerned I found upon examination to be correct; but have had to take exception to the cash balance brought forward from the year 1874, because I found that the amount in the Bank on 31st December, 1874, after allowing for cheques drawn for that year but not presented, exceeded the balance stated in the account by £88 0s. 7d. I have therefore referred the Accounts back to the Warden, but have not yet received the required explanation.

Out of sixty-seven Road Trusts sixty-two have furnished accounts for 1875 in a complete form; the four under-mentioned Trusts have also furnished Accounts but have not at present replied to questions raised upon them, viz., Bridgewater, Broad Marsh, Port Cygnet, and Tarleton; and one, Lower Sorell, has not forwarded any Account: in this case, however, the present Chairman has informed me that no Trust has existed for the last three years, but that new Trustees had been appointed this year.

At the request of the Government I have also examined and certified to the Accounts of the six Rabbit Trusts.

One of these questions being as to the right of the Company to retain the Interest gained in London on Deposits in the Bank of New South Wales, on account of the Main Line Railway Company's Contract for the construction of the Line, the sum so gained according to Letter 72 of Main Line Railway Correspondence, House of Assembly Paper 29, 1875, being ± 5965 4s. 8d., to 31st December, 1874.

In returning the accompanying documents, forwarded by the Hon. the Colonial Secretary for their remarks, the Trustees of the Hobart Town Public Cemetery have to observe :---

That after the passing of "The Cemeteries Amendment Act, 1870," the Hobart Town Public Cemetery was provided to meet the wants of the City of Hobart Town and suburbs, upon the understanding that no other Cemetery would be established within a considerable distance of the General Post Office, Hobart Town.

A Bill was laid before Parliament in 1872, which, amongst other things, proposed to limit the distance of any new Cemetery to *three* miles from the General Post Office. This proposal did not meet the views of the Legislature, who substituted the words one mile and a half for three miles, and with this and other minor alterations the Bill became law.

Until the passing of this Act the revenue derived from the Public Cemetery was quite sufficient to meet the expenses, interest on capital, and also redemption fund; but in a short time a public company was formed for the purpose of establishing a Cemetery at Queenborough, within a distance of less than two miles from the General Post Office, and about one-half the distance from that Office of the Public Cemetery.

After the establishment of the Queenborough Company, the interments in the Public Cemetery rapidly decreased in number, so much so that the year 1874 has closed with a loss of £253. The Public Cemetery appears, however, again to have acquired the confidence of the public; the interments in public graves being 31 for the first quarter of this year, against the same number for the whole of 1874. The receipts have, of course, also materially increased. The Trustees have recently reviewed the expenditure and have effected certain reductions, and the Cemetery is now managed at the lowest cost possible consistent with efficiency.

The 3rd section of "The Cemeteries Amendment Act, 1870," requires the one per cent. in aid of the Redemption Fund to be paid at such periods as the Governor in Council shall direct; and as the Trustees have great difficulty in meeting the interest on capital, they suggest for the consideration of the Government that, at present, it would be highly impolitic to insist on the payment of any sum in aid of such Redemption Fund.

The Trustees feel compelled to draw attention to the fact that, upon the sale of the Debentures under "The Cemeteries Loans Act, 1870," premiums to the amount of £240 were received and paid to the credit of the General Revenue. The Trustees submit that this sum might be made available to meet the amount now claimed in aid of the Redemption Fund, should the Governor in Couucil insist upon the immediate formation of such fund.
