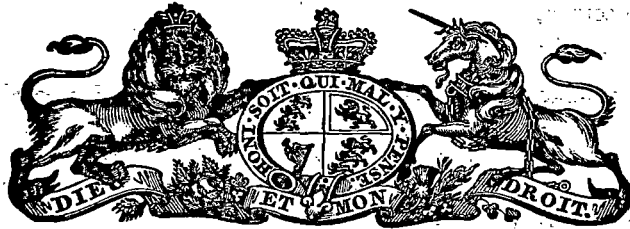

MONDAY, JANUARY 16, 1871.

MINUTE No. 11.

UNDER the provisions of *The Superannuation Act*, His Excellency approves of Samuel M'Neilly, Gate-keeper at the General Hospital, Hobart Town, being allowed compensation for the loss of his office to the amount of £59 7s.

His Excellency grants to Mrs. Catherine M. Peel, in consequence of the abolition of her office as Matron at the General Hospital, Hobart Town, a Pension at the rate of £45 16s. per annum. To take effect as soon as her present engagement under the Board of Immigration ceases.

MONDAY, JANUARY 23, 1871.

MINUTE No. 26.

With the view of making better and more economical arrangements for the supervision of the Boys' Division at the Queen's Asylum, His Excellency approves of Mrs. Bourne, the Matron, being allowed to retire from the public service upon a Pension of £38 3s. 8d. per annum: to take effect on the 1st instant, and to be provided for upon a Supplementary Estimate.

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 11, 1871.

MINUTE No. 258.

His Excellency approves of Mrs. Sarah Hayes Wright being granted a Pension, upon her ceasing to hold the appointment of Schoolmistress at Green Ponds, at the rate of £3 6s. 8d. per annum. To take effect on and from the 1st April, 1870.

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 6, 1871.

MINUTE No. 318.

His Excellency approves of the Pension granted to Mrs. Sarah Hayes Wright on the 19th September last being allowed to commence on the 1st March, 1870, instead of on the 1st April.
