




Return to an Order of the Council of March 6, 1863. (Mr. Innes.)

Question.—A Statement from the Director of Public Works of the Estimate, if any, of the late Director of Public Works, W. P. Kay, Esq., for the erection of the Public Offices, Launceston?

Answer.—No detailed Estimate was provided. The late Director of Public Works, W. P. Kay, Esq., in submitting the Draft Estimates of his Department for this and other works, inserted a sum of £10,000 for new Public Buildings at Launceston; and a Vote, by Loans Bill, 21 Vict. No. 29, was taken for that amount.

Question.—The several Tenders for the undertaking?

Answer.—SCHEDULE of Tenders received on 30 December, 1858, for the erection of the New Public Offices at Launceston.

Question.—The several heads of additions to the original Contract, with the causes of such additions?

Answer.—1st. At the commencement of the work I found the site had been erroneously set out. This had to be altered so as to admit of the buildings standing in the centre of the block instead of on one side of it.

2nd. It was found very undesirable to have a shingle roof, and a material and necessary alteration was made substituting for it a slate roof.

3rd. Accommodation had to be provided for an Office-keeper, with requisite out-buildings to the Offices.

4th. A change in the position of the portion for Post Office purposes from Cameron-street to Patterson-street, with a new Portico to the Post Office Wing.

5th. Iron palisading and gates for principal fronts, for the safety of, and so as to enclose and secure, the building.

- 6th. Stone parapets were substituted for wooden ones; also stone jambs to doorways, and a stone string-course, with other alterations.
- 7th. Internal fittings for Post Office and Telegraph Offices, grates, &c. throughout the buildings not provided for in the original Contract.
 - 8th. Laying on water and gas, and gas fittings, with supervision and incidentals.
- Question.—Date on which original Contract was taken, and the subsequent additions to it were made?
- Answer.—The original Contract authorising the acceptance of the Tender of James Porter at £12,850, it being the lowest, was made on 3rd January, 1859, (on letter of 31st December, 1858, signed W. P. Kay.)

The Governor in Council, on 20th February, 1861, authorised the payment of £2850 in excess of the sum voted by Bill 24 Vict. No. 29; this sum being the difference between the amount of original Contract and such Vote.

The Governor in Council authorised, on the 8th May, 1861, a further sum of £5400 for the several heads of additions necessarily made to original Contract as hereinbefore stated.
