

REPORT FOR 1895.

Charitable Grants Department, New Town, 31st March, 1896.

Sir,

I have the honor to submit the following Report on this Department for the year 1895.

From the 1st January to the 31st March the work of the Department was carried on through the Office of the Honorable the Chief Secretary, and from the latter date the work was placed in my charge.

On the retirement of Mr. O'Boyle at the beginning of the year a change in the administration of the Out-door Relief was instituted by the Government, whereby the Out-door Relief in Hobart and Launceston was handed over to the Benevolent Societies of those Cities; and a certain sum was allotted out of the Parliamentary Votes to the Wardens and Stipendiary Magistrates of the various Municipal and Police Districts for Out-door Relief, Medical Attendance on Paupers in Country Districts, and temporary provision for Tramps.

Out-door Relief, Medical Attendance on Paupers, &c.

The sum of £71 11s. 1d. was received as repayments; viz.—£35 8s. 3d. by Collectors, and £36 2s. 10d. from Imperial Government, leaving a net expenditure for 1895 of £3964 5s. 11d.—£225 14s. 1d. less than the total sum voted by Parliament. In addition to this amount the sum of £42 0s. 9d. was paid on account of 1894.

Transport and Funeral Expenses.

The sum voted for this service was £500, and the amount expended for 1895 was £362 17s. 3d., or £137 2s. 9d. less than the Parliamentary vote. In addition to this expenditure the sum of £89 12s. 9d. was paid on account of 1894. The sum of £18 1s. 5d. was received as repayments.

Imperial Claims.

The total claim upon the Imperial Government for repayment of the cost of Imperial Paupers maintained in various Institutions, and in receipt of Out-door Relief, during the year amounted to £1176 4s. 8d.

Lying-in Home.

On the 31st March last the Lying-in Home was transferred to the New Town Charitable Institution, and the services of Mrs. Boam, the Resident Midwife, dispensed with.

From the time of the transfer to the end of the year there were 12 admissions, of whom 3 were remaining in the Home at the end of the year. The births for that period were 4 boys and 5 girls.

Industrial and Training Schools.

During the year there were 4 boys and 12 girls committed to the Industrial Schools, Hobart and Launceston, and 14 boys and 4 girls to the Training Schools, Hobart, maintained at the expense of the Government.
