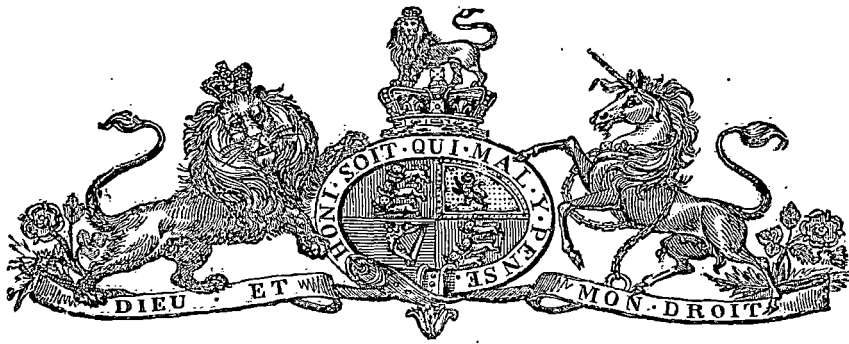

REPORT.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

WE, the Commissioners appointed by Your Excellency to manage and regulate the affairs of the Parliamentary Library, have the honor to report that we have held several Meetings, and have purchased, by an economical arrangement with a Bookseller in Hobart Town, such Books as we have considered necessary to be added to the Library.

The Librarian has made to us the necessary Annual Report on the state of the Library, which we annex.

Parliamentary Library, 23rd July, 1868.

I HAVE the honor to report that, during the fortnight ended to-day, I have taken stock of the Books in the Library, (5690 volumes), and find them to correspond with the Printed Catalogue except 35 volumes (No. 1), which have been taken out of the Library since March, 1867, without compliance with the Rule which requires that their issue should be entered in the Issue Book, or the Librarian informed that they had been taken out. They are doubtless in the hands of Members.

When I re-took charge of the Library in March, 1867, I could not trace 114 Volumes. Of these I am happy to say all have been recovered except 12 volumes (No. 2), which I have failed to recover. Their cost price was £7 15s. This has been the value of books which must now, I fear, be said to be lost to the Library since its establishment in October, 1856.

The Books generally are in good condition; though some of them require to be bound.

Under a Contract made with Mr. Fletcher, 43 volumes of Magazines have been bound at a charge of 3s. 3d. a volume.

The Books named in the annexed List (No. 3) have been purchased by the Royal Commission during the Recess, under a Contract with Messrs. Walch & Sons to supply them at the London publishing price, free of all further charge.
