

To the Honorable the Speaker and Members of the House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled.

THE undersigned Landowners and others residing in the Districts of Selby and Morven beg respectfully to bring under notice of your Honorable House the necessity of opening a Road for conveyances from Launceston to the Black Boy, by way of the White Hills and Watery Plains, by which a saving of considerable distance may be effected. The recent discoveries of Gold in the Fingal District daily increases the traffic; and we trust this our Memorial may be favourably entertained.
