



MINUTE PAPER FOR THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

SUBMITTED,

THAT the sum of Fifteen thousand nine hundred Pounds, which was proposed by the Government last Session of Parliament to be charged to the permanent debt of the Colony on account of works sanctioned by Parliament, and set forth in the annexed list, but which proposal was not assented to, be, for the present and until the question shall have been brought under the notice of Parliament, provided by a "Suspense Account;" and that the amount charged to the year 1884 out of the votes for the said works, £8496 1s. 3d., be transferred to and charged against such Suspense Account.
