

REPORT FROM THE SELECT COMMITTEE.

REPORT.

Your Committee have the honor to report to your Honorable House that, having carefully considered the matter referred to them, they would suggest the following Amendments:—

Interpretation Clause, Section 2, Sub-section 7, by inserting after the words "Debentures" the words "and any Debentures or Securities the principal or interest of which is guaranteed by the Government of Tasmania."

Section 43, Sub-section 6.—After the word "application" insert the words "or proceeding."

Section 57, line 28.—After the word "is" insert the words "an insane person or;" and in same line, after the word "the," insert the words "receiver or." Insert in the margin of this Section, opposite the word "receiver," the words and figures "22 Vict. No. 23, Section 39."

After full consideration of the other Clauses, they were recommended to stand as printed.

The Members of the Committee having had further opportunity of considering the general effect of the Bill, as well as its several Clauses, are unanimously of opinion that the Bill, if passed, will be a great improvement on existing legislation, being more general in its operation, and yet less cumbrous and less expensive in its machinery; and they recommend the House to pass the said Bill, with the Amendments above suggested.
