



REPORT OF THE CHIEF INSPECTOR OF SHEEP.

Inspector of Sheep Office, Hobart Town, 17th July, 1878.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to submit the following Report upon the working of the Scab Act, and the condition of Sheep in Tasmania, during the years 1877-8 to this date.

At the date of my last Report, the 10th July, 1877, there were under licence 5414 sheep, principally in the Spring Bay district. A few of them were also in the districts of Brighton, New Norfolk, Huon, and Richmond. Subsequently, however, it was discovered that the numbers infected in the Spring Bay district were greater than was known at the date of my Report; but all, with two exceptions, the property of owners who had sheep under licence. The exceptional cases were in the immediate neighbourhood of the other infected flocks.

Additional inspecting power was immediately brought from the northern and midland districts by the removal of the Inspector from Deloraine to Oatlands and Green Ponds, and the temporary removal of the midland Inspector to Spring Bay.

It is now reported to me by the several Inspectors that all the districts in which there were sheep under licence in 1877, so far as they know, are clean; but I am of opinion that I am not yet justified in recommending that all of them should be declared "Clean Sheep Districts" under Section 10, "Scab Act, 1875."

This I think may be considered satisfactory; and had it not been for a case which cropped up in May last on a run near Table Mountain, in a part of the Bothwell district not included in "No. 2 Clean Sheep District" (which originally embraced the whole of the municipalities of Hamilton and Bothwell), I should have been able to state now that I believed the whole of the country to be clean.

The run referred to has changed owners two or three times since the Scab Act came in force. It is somewhat rough, although not more so than many parts of Tasmania where sheep were cleaned five years ago. A certain amount of suspicion has always attached to it; and on various occasions I have directed the sheep to be inspected, but without anything wrong being discovered. In May last, however, a diseased sheep from the flock in question was found in a flock on an adjoining run. The Inspector was immediately sent for; but as his sudden death occurred just at the time, I had to despatch the midland Inspector, Mr. Thomas Tabart, who at once proceeded to the spot near Interlaken, and found the stray sheep to be diseased. I then thought it desirable to afford Mr. Tabart assistance, and directed Mr. Malcolm Harrison and Mr. Wilson to at once proceed to Interlaken and place themselves in communication with Mr. Tabart with the view of inspecting all the flocks in the neighbourhood of Lakes Sorell and Crescent and around Table Mountain. All the surrounding flocks were, on examination, found to be clean excepting the one adjoining the flock in which the diseased sheep had been found, viz., a flock of Mr. Thomas Savage's, on a run called Bell's Run. In this flock, 1250 in number, one sheep only was found with a spot of scab upon it; but I have every reason to believe that other diseased sheep had been destroyed by the person in charge in order to deceive the Inspector, and possibly altogether conceal the fact that the flock was an infected one.

Mr. Tabart, on my instruction, seized this flock under Section 2, "Scab Act, 1877," and placed an experienced person in charge, who will remain in charge until the Inspector can safely pronounce the sheep to be clean according to law. That they are actually clean at this moment I feel assured, as the gentleman (Mr. Wood) who has charge of them has always been successful on the various occasions when employed in a similar manner by this Department.

The flock in which the stray diseased sheep was found consisted of 1848 wethers, the property

of Mr. Kermode. This flock of course had to be dipped twice as a precaution,—a most unfortunate circumstance for Mr. Kermode, involving a heavy loss in deterioration of wool, and injury to the sheep through being dipped in such cold weather in the Lake Country.

To avoid the possibility of this matter being bruited abroad in a distorted form to Mr. Kermode's prejudice as a large breeder of stud sheep, I think it right to state that Interlaken is about 30 miles from Mona Vale where his pure sheep are kept. No disease whatever was found in his flock at Interlaken. The sheep were only dipped in compliance with the law as a precautionary measure of public safety, as well as being the safest course for the owner.

It will thus be seen that there is a reasonable probability of my being able, at no distant date, to advise you that Tasmania may be declared clean. But even if no new case should crop up subsequent to this time, I am inclined to think that it will not be wise to declare the whole Colony clean any time during the current year; although probably two or three of the districts I have referred to may be declared "Clean Sheep Districts" in the course of a few months.

The number of sheep has still continued to increase, notwithstanding the unfavourable nature of the winter and summer of 1877. The Table underneath shows the number of sheep, and the quantity and value of wool exported each year, from the 30th June of one year to the 1st July of the following, made up from Customs Returns of wool exported, and number of sheep returned to this office since 1870:—

The above Return conclusively proves the success of the Scab Act, and the extreme moderation of my calculations made in 1869, and revised in 1872. As I observed in my last Report, it needs no comment from me further than drawing attention to the fact that now, with only a small increase in the number of sheep, as compared with 1868-9, the quantity of wool exported in 1877-8 shows an increase, on the average quantity exported in former years, of 2,436,453 lbs. About 5,000,000 lbs. was the average of former years up to the passing of the Scab Act. This enormous increase in the quantity of wool exported from Tasmania is, in my opinion, almost entirely attributable to the beneficial operation of the Act. And once again I would ask those sheepowners (and there are some) who look upon the contribution to the Scab Act Fund as a tax, to look at the above figures and consider what an enormous per-cent has been added to their incomes by the expenditure of the small contribution which has been levied upon their sheep under the Scab Act. And again I would say to any of those who doubt the correctness of the figures I have given, refer to your shearing returns and account sales of wool now and compare them with those anterior to 1870. Such a reference, I fancy, can only result in one conclusion in the minds of all men who will divest themselves of preconceived ideas and honestly accept the irresistible logic of facts.

The additional quantity of wool produced in Tasmania is only one item in the account; but I will not refer to the others here. In an Appendix to this Report (marked A) I will revise my calculations of 1869 and 1872, and endeavour to show, within reasonable limits, the extent to which the Scab Act has added to the incomes of sheepowners, and consequently to that of the public.

The number of stud sheep exported in 1877 did not reach the number exported in 1876 by about 100; and the Customs Return of value is less in a much greater proportion than it ought to be, within my own knowledge, of the prices realised on the greater number of the sheep exported. However, as I cannot give an absolutely correct Return of my own, I give that from the Customs Department as usual. I believe, however, that the amount received from our exports of sheep in 1877 was at least 50 per cent. more than the Return shows.

In connection with the subject of our export of stud sheep, I have much satisfaction in being able to state that the Quarantine Regulations of New South Wales have been modified both at Sydney and on the Murray. At Sydney the quarantine is now only 21 days, instead of 60 days as formerly; and on the Murray the quarantine of Victoria is accepted as sufficient. This is a great concession; and I think is as much as we can expect until the time arrives when the flocks of Tasmania can safely be declared absolutely free from disease.

The number of cattle returned in the Live Stock Statistics for the years 1873 to 1877 showed a gradual increase, which has been continued in the returns for the current year, as follows:—

21 head of stud cattle landed at the Port of Launceston are included in the above return; they were valued at £2200.

During the year 1877, 709,572 rabbit skins were exported, valued at £5110. From this any one not acquainted with the country might imagine that the rabbit plague is being overcome. Such is not the case, however, I am sorry to say. On the contrary, I see signs of the increase and spread of rabbits wherever I have been, excepting in the Midland Districts, where the settlers have been exerting themselves to destroy the rabbits, and are erecting rabbit-proof fences very extensively. This appears to be the only remedy where one settler destroys his rabbits only to have them replaced from the run of his adjoining neighbour, who is either insensible to the danger or too slothful to cope with it energetically.

The Reports from New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia, and Victoria are that the sheep in those colonies remain absolutely free from the scab disease. From New Zealand I have only received Returns from Otago, Canterbury, and Hawkes Bay. There also the sheep are reported free from disease.

The number of sheep specially inspected by the District Inspectors from the 30th June, 1877, to the 30th June, 1878, was 720,000, and miles travelled 31,095.

Appended to this Report is a detailed Return of sheep throughout the Municipal and Police Districts, showing their condition at this date, together with the names of the owners.

I also append a Return of the number of cattle, sheep, and pigs received at the Hobart Town Main Line Railway Station, which Mr. C. H. Grant has been good enough to furnish me with. It refers to a matter which is of much interest to settlers and consumers of meat in Hobart Town, and not altogether unconnected with the working of the Scab Act, inasmuch as sheep would not be allowed to travel through the country by rail unless they were clean.

This calculation is based upon the assumption that when Scab is eradicated in Tasmania dipping sheep will wholly cease, excepting for the destruction of ticks; and that will only be required at intervals of some years. In the neighbouring Colonies where the sheep are clean, they are never dressed unless for ticks at intervals of years, according to circumstances and the opinion of the sheepowner. I have had sheep myself at Portland Bay, in the Colony of Victoria, that were taken from this country and of course were scabby. After they were cleaned they were never dressed again for 11 years in any form or for any purpose.
