



SIR.

I have the honor to inform you that the several Statements of Account of the Consolidated Revenue having been carefully examined and found correct, and were returned to the Treasury a few days since, certified in the usual manner, and to submit my Report thereon for the information of Parliament, in accordance with Section 4 of the "Audit Act," No. 3.

REPORT.

REVENUE.

Revenue proper.—The Revenue proper of 1882 may be stated to amount to £549,295 10s. 1d.; viz., £546,882 18s. 1d. received and brought to account, and £2412 12s. estimated to be due by the Home Government on account of the year under review—the increase upon the Revenue of 1881 being £48,014 0s. 9d. It is satisfactory to note that every item of Revenue, excepting that of Real and Personal Estate Duty, shows substantial improvement: this exception does not however denote an actual reduction of Revenue, a considerable portion of the rates not having been paid into the Treasury before 1883 owing to the late date in 1882 on which the demands were issued.

It is regretted that two cases of deficiency in the accounts of Collectors of Revenue have been discovered since last report:—

1st. An investigation of the accounts of the then Deputy Commissioner of Crown Lands in September, 1882, disclosed a deficiency of £1266 17s. 3d. The case was reported on 26th September, 1882, and under an arrangement made by the Government Mr. Hull was permitted to pay the amount upon the understanding that an opportunity would be afforded him to examine the accounts, and in the event of any overcharge being discovered the amount thereof would be refunded; but although it is understood that Mr. Hull has been allowed every possible facility for a thorough investigation, and the Government have gone so far as to offer to appoint an Accountant to assist, he has taken no steps to clear himself from the grave suspicion which the present aspect of the case causes. In addition to the above, a further deficiency of £260 5s. 6d. has since been discovered, through the receipt of applications from several persons for repayment of sums paid to Mr. Hull which he had not brought to account or recorded in the books of the office, nor has he subsequently taken any steps to explain the irregularity although repeatedly requested to do so; it appears also from a recent communication received from the Lands Office that it is probable that further claims may be received which would increase the present known deficiency. The latter amount has also been paid by Mr. Hull.

In order that this case may be clearly understood by Parliament, it is necessary to enter into a full explanation of the circumstances. In April, 1882, Mr. Hull was attacked by illness, was allowed leave of absence, and his duties were undertaken by Mr. G. F. Lovett, at that time Ministerial Clerk to the Minister of Lands and Works: it was then discovered, if it was not known before by the Lands Department, that numerous applications for Mineral Leases, for purchase of Crown Lands, &c., the sums remitted with which amounted in the aggregate to the ascertained deficiency, had been received by Mr. Hull but had not been brought to account or recorded in the books of the office. These were, as quickly as the pressure of work in the office would permit, brought to account, included in the Monthly Returns, and the amounts also included in the cheques drawn upon the Bank Account, under the impression that, although not entered in the accounts previously, the money had been deposited; but in September of the same year, when the majority of the arrears had been dealt with, the cheque sent to the Treasury for the August return of Revenue, and presented to the Commercial Bank, the Manager returned it for explanation, in consequence of the large overdraft which the payment would have caused, and for which no arrangement had been made.

It is also desirable to explain that, according to arrangements made by the Treasurer under Section 4 of the General Regulations under the Audit Act, 22 Vict. No. 6, it has been the understood rule for the

Deputy Commissioner of Crown Lands to pay over monthly the amount of his collections to the Treasury; and the requirements of the Audit Act had been complied with as far as could be seen, the usual statutory declaration required under Section 10 having been appended to the returns forwarded month by month; it is evident, however, that the returns did not include the whole of the collections, and that therefore false statements had been furnished, although solemnly declared to as "true and faithful statements of all collections received" during the particular month.

The arrangements introduced for keeping the accounts of the Department were sufficient to establish as good a check as possible with respect to receipts, if carried out; but the internal office management appears to have been so defective in this respect as to permit of letters containing remittances of money being put on one side without being recorded, thus giving an opportunity to anyone in charge of the cash to hide a deficiency with very little risk of detection.

In January, 1880, when the Bank Account was examined by the Audit Department and reconciled with the accounts of the Lands Department, there appeared to be a sum of £2 15s. 3d. short deposited, which Mr. Hull stated he could not explain, but arranged to pay in the amount, with the ostensible object of balancing the accounts to that date, and on referring to the Bank Book subsequently it was found that this amount was deposited on the 28th February of the same year: it now appears by no means certain that a deficiency did not actually exist at that time, hidden by the system before referred to.

2nd. In February last it was discovered that several items of Light-house Rates, amounting to £108 17s. 8d., collected by the Chief Clerk of the Customs Department, Launceston, Mr. C. Hardinge, had not been paid over to the Treasury. The defalcation was reported to the Government, who prosecuted Hardinge at a recent Sessions of the Criminal Court at Launceston, where he was found guilty, and received a sentence for the offence. The amount is recoverable from the Australian Alliance Assurance Company, from whom the Government holds a Bond as security for the fidelity of the individual referred to.

Pastoral and Mineral Leases.—After repeated reference to the Lands Department for explanation as to the cause of large arrears of Rents due by the Lessees of Pastoral Lands without receiving satisfactory replies, the matter was brought under the notice of Parliament in my report dated 30th June, 1881; and in the next report, dated 30th June, 1882, in noticing that no satisfactory arrangements had been subsequently introduced, it was pointed out that, as a natural consequence, the cases of default in the payment of these rents were increasing month by month; but notwithstanding that several reminders have since been forwarded to the Honorable the Minister of Lands, through the Honorable the Treasurer, no definite arrangement appears to have been made for ensuring payment or for the collection of arrears,—nothing but vague replies having been received: for instance, in a letter from the Lands Department, dated 6th January, 1883, it is stated that "the matter of overdue payments in connection with Rentals of Crown Lands was occupying the attention of the Minister of Lands and Works;" and in the last communication received on this subject, dated 26th May, the Deputy Commissioner of Crown Lands says, "with regard to the Auditor's remarks on the Minister's letter relating to Leased Lands, it is as well to remark that the matter has not been lost sight of. The books of this office have been carefully examined, and a note made of every lease for which the rent has not been received. A list has been made, and compared with and corrected by the charts. This list was forwarded to the Treasury a few days ago, and when compared with the Treasury Books and returned, will be submitted to the Minister of Lands and Works for instructions as to the action to be taken."

It will be seen from the above that this matter is very slightly, if at all, removed from the position brought under notice three years ago. There cannot be any reasonable excuse for this inaction, as the law provides a sufficient remedy in this case, as it does in that of Mineral Leases, a marked improvement in the collection of these Rentals having taken place simply because the Law has been for some time enforced without unreasonable delay: why the wrong should be allowed to continue in the other case is unaccountable. The Audit Department has no power to do more than report neglect and irregularities which come under its notice, and therefore must depend upon the Government and Parliament to introduce measures for the correction of abuses when informed of their existence.

EXPENDITURE.

Ordinary.—The Ordinary Expenditure chargeable to the Consolidated Revenue for the year 1882 already ascertained amounts to £485,449 1s. 9d.; viz.—

It is estimated that the outstanding claims against the Revenue of 1882 amount to £15,000; another instalment of Treasury Bills, amounting to £10,000, has also been paid and charged against this year. The total Expenditure, therefore, will probably amount to £510,449 1s. 9d.

Appendix A.—Appended, as usual, is a Return (A.) of Expenditure not previously sanctioned by Parliament, but authorised by the Governor in Council under Section 19 of the Regulations under the

Audit Act, No. 3, during 1882; also, including an item £168 5s. 1d., authorised in the same way previously to 1882, for which no provision has yet been made.

Supplementary Estimates, 1882.—On comparing the Supplementary Appropriation for 1882, 46 Vict. No. 33, with the Supplementary Estimates for that year, the amount appropriated to the Post Office Department is stated at £344 12s. 4d.; whereas, in the Supplementary Estimates, approved and forwarded to the Audit Department, the aggregate of the items voted for the former Department amount to £394 12s. 4d. In reply to enquiry from this Office as to the discrepancy, the Honorable the Treasurer states "Parliament reduced the increase of salary to the Secretary of the Post Office from £100 to £50 when dealing with the Appropriation Act, 46 Vict. No. 33, but did not place on record any special resolution with respect to this item." The increased salary paid to the Secretary had amounted to £58 6s. 8d., being at the rate of £100 per annum for seven months, under the authority of the Governor in Council, before the Supplementary Estimates referred to were passed,—placing the Audit Department in a most awkward position. In last year's report a somewhat similar irregularity was brought under notice, and a hope expressed that the alterations might be confirmed by Parliament in a systematic manner, but it does not appear that any action in the required direction has been taken; it is hoped, however, that, in justice to this Department, the necessary provision in both cases will be made during the ensuing Session of Parliament.

Excesses provided under Loans Expenditure.—Several amounts which have not, and are not likely to be, required for the purposes for which they were voted have appeared as credits in the ledger for several years; it is therefore desirable that they should be written off. As, in most cases, the Debentures under which this money has been obtained have been renewed, and included in the Debt of the Colony, the most equitable mode of dealing with the items appears to be to pay the amount over to credit of the Public Debts Sinking Fund. There are three other credit balances also brought forward for many years which might be dealt with in a similar manner; viz.—Sorell Causeway Rate, £241 11s. 3d.; Equity Causes, £153 11s.; Money of Colonial Prisoners not claimed, £1 1s. 6d.

Debt of the Colony.—The Debt of the Colony is stated in the Balance Sheet on 31st December, 1882, at £2,051,300, being the actual cash transactions on Loans Account to that date, including £70,000 for Treasury Bills outstanding redeemable from the Consolidated Revenue during 1883, 1884, and 1885. In giving the figures below the latter amount is excluded, as also a sum of £700 for Debentures due but not presented for payment; the Debt will thus amount to £2,416,350; viz.—

PUBLIC BODIES.

Municipal.—The accounts of eighteen Municipalities have been examined and passed. Those for Glenorchy have not yet been rendered. For some years past the accounts of this Municipality have been a source of trouble and inconvenience to this Department through neglect on the part of those responsible to carry out the instructions issued from time to time as to the method of keeping the books, and to furnish proper returns and vouchers without unreasonable delay. No improvement, but rather the reverse, having been experienced this year, it has been necessary to address a special letter to the Warden and Councillors on the subject, and also to request the Honorable the Treasurer to withhold payment of further grants until a more favourable report can be forwarded. Considerable inconvenience was also experienced in 1882 with respect to the 1881 accounts of the Municipalities of Hamilton and New Norfolk, which were stated to be under examination when the last Report was written. It is satisfactory, however, to report that the accounts of these two Municipalities for the year 1882 have been correctly and promptly rendered.

ROAD TRUSTS.

Road Trusts.—The accounts of the Road Trusts, seventy-six in number, have been examined and passed. The Hamilton, Huon, and George Town accounts for 1881 were not rendered until very late in the year 1882; but this year more promptness has been shown. The Port Cygnet accounts for 1881 were rendered in so defective a state as to cause much trouble to put them in order; and those for 1882, the statements and vouchers were forwarded in a most discreditable state, necessitating numerous queries, which have only been satisfied within the last few days.

Main Road Board Accounts.—The Main Road Board Accounts, forty-six in number, including thirteen districts under the Commissioner, have been examined and finally passed. The Port Cygnet accounts, as in the case of the Road Trust, were in a most unsatisfactory condition. A special report was attached to these accounts and published, by which it will be seen that £19 19s. 6d. had

been disallowed, as expenditure incurred contrary to the provisions of the Main Roads Act. The Latrobe and Emu Bay accounts for 1881 were not received until September and December, 1882, respectively.

Marine Boards.—The Marine Board accounts, six in number, have been passed and published, including Hobart and Launceston.

Rabbit Trusts.—Seven Rabbit Trusts accounts have been duly audited, and the balance in hand in each case has been paid to the Treasury in accordance with the provisions of Act 46 Vict. No. 35.

Cemetery Trusts.—The accounts of eight Cemetery Trusts have been examined and passed; those for Beaconsfield, Cornelian Bay, Montagu, Sheffield, and Waratah have not yet been rendered.

Tarleton Road Trust Loan.—No steps appear to have been taken with respect to the repayment of this Loan of £1000, referred to in last Report.

Tasmanian Public Library.—The accounts of this Library have been audited. A special letter was addressed to the Chairman with respect to the intended appropriation of a grant received under Appropriation Act, which should be published with the Report of the Trustees.

Tasmanian Main Line Railway.—The accounts of this Railway have been duly audited to 31st December, 1882, and a special report thereon forwarded.

General.—Referring to remarks in last report respecting the incompleteness of the check in consequence of the present mode in which the Assessment Rolls are published, it is noticed that no steps have been taken to supply a remedy as proposed. It is hoped that the matter may receive the attention it demands during the ensuing Session of Parliament.

TRUST FUNDS.

Assurance Fund, Real Property Act.—This account has been examined, and found correct. The amount to credit on 31st December, 1882, was £4712 16s. 2d., of which the sum of £4700 was invested in Tasmanian Government Debentures at that date.

Public Debts Sinking Fund.—The amount to credit of this Fund on 31st December, 1882, was £58,822 11s. 6d.; viz.—

of which £58,800 has been invested in Tasmanian Government Debentures. The annual account to 30th June of this year will be examined as soon as received, and a special report will be appended.

Post Office Savings' Bank .- The accounts of this Trust have not yet been received for audit.

Inspection of Accounts.

The partial, and therefore unsatisfactory, manner in which the intentions of certain provisions of the Audit Act in respect to the personal examination of accounts had, previously to November last, been carried out in consequence of the want of a sufficient staff, had for many years caused me considerable anxiety, and several letters were addressed to the Government on the subject, without receiving, as far as is known, any attention much before that date. The introduction of the Post Office Savings' Bank system, however, rendered it imperative to appoint an inspecting staff, and two Inspectors of Accounts have consequently been added to the strength of the Audit Department, and the work of personal inspection has been since carried out more efficiently.

Queries, &c.

A considerable number of queries and letters remain unanswered (Appendix B), some of which seem to be of sufficient importance to require special notice: the correspondence in reference thereto is therefore attached in Appendix C herewith. Query No. 110, of 15th June instant, although having no reference to the accounts of 1882, is included, as the matter appears to be of so irregular a nature as to require immediate reference to Parliament for consideration.

Minute Paper for the Executive Council.

Treasury, Hobart, 4th June, 1883.

On the 24th January last a deputation of the Trustees of the "Campbell Town Water Trust," with other persons interested in the district, introduced by the Hon. Thos. D. Chapman, waited on the Government and explained that Parliament having authorised the Trustees to raise a sum not exceeding seven thousand pounds for the purposes of the Trust, on the faith of which they had entered into contracts, which were approaching completion, the Trustees had made an unsuccessful attempt to raise the sum required by the sale of their Debentures in the open market, the lowest rate of interest demanded being 7½ per cent., on the ground that the Debentures were not guaranteed by the Government. As the bonds would have some 25 or 30 years to run, the Trustees did not feel justified in saddling the ratepayers of the district with so high a rate of interest for so long a period without first endeavouring to obtain the assent of Parliament to the Debentures being guaranteed by the Government, which would materially reduce the rate of interest at which the money could be borrowed.

The Trustees having expressed their willingness to give the Government their personal guarantee, by bill at twelve months, with interest added, as security for the repayment of any moneys advanced to enable the Trustees to meet their obligations on account of "The Campbell Town Water Trust," the Treasurer submits that he be authorised to advance and lend to the Trustees of "The Campbell Town Water Trust," a sum not exceeding seven thousand pounds, bearing interest at the rate of 5 per cent. per annum, secured as aforesaid, the amount to be advanced out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund and charged to a Suspense Account, pending the decision of Parliament on the case-to he laid before the Legislature for consideration.
