



LETTER OF BOARD OF IMMIGRATION.

Laid before the House by the Colonial Treasurer, September 15, 1868, and ordered by the House to be printed.



Immigration Office, 15th September, 1868.

SIR.

I have the honor by direction of the Board of Immigration to inform you that, at a meeting held this day, the Commissioners had under their consideration an application from Mr. Thomas Shaw, requesting that he might be allowed to select Thirty acres of Land under the provisions of the 31st Vict. No. 26.

This case is precisely similar to Lieut.-Colonel Fulton's; and as the Parliament have sanctioned the selection of land by the latter gentleman, the Board respectfully recommend that in like manner Mr. Shaw be allowed to select Thirty acres of Land subject to the decision of Parliament.
