Please see Attachment 2 for the breakdown of projects that make up the total of investment facilitated by the Office of the Coordinator-General since 2015-16 through to 2023-24. These projects have been divided into three status categories: 1) Achieved operation; 2) Pre-operation; and 3) On-hold, on-sold or withdrawn.

As shown in the tables, for the period outlined to end of 2023-24, the Office has facilitated over \$4.922 billion of investment with approximately \$2 billion of projects having been completed (i.e. reached achieved operation), which created more than 3,005 construction and operational jobs.
