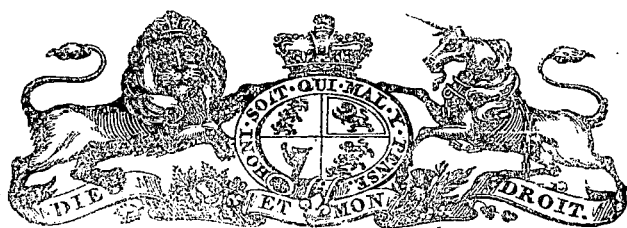

THE several Statements of Account of the Consolidated Revenue of the year 1883 having been examined and found correct, are returned with the usual certificate, and I have the honor to submit my Report thereon, as required by Section 4 of the Regulations under the Audit Act, No. 3.

REPORT.

REVENUE.

Revenue proper.—The Revenue proper of the year 1883, received and estimated, amounts to £560,179 2s. 6d.; viz.—Received, £558,179 2s. 6d., and estimated as outstanding, £2000. The increase and decrease under the several heads are shown in the following table:—

Mr. Hull's deficiencies.—Respecting the matter of the deficiency in the accounts of the Deputy-Commissioner of Crown Lands, brought under notice in my Report on the accounts of the year 1882, it has been discovered that, in addition to the sum of £1527 2s. 9d. then noticed, further items received by Mr. Hull, amounting to £37 15s., had not been brought to account. This additional irregularity has been brought to light through receipt of applications from individuals for repayment of amounts forwarded to the Survey Office. As far as is known to this Office, Mr. Hull has not attempted in any way to investigate the accounts for the purpose of explaining the irregularities reported. He has, however, been permitted by the Government to make up these deficiencies, and also to retire upon a reduced pension under the 7th Section of the Superannuation Act.

Real Estate Duties deficiencies.—Upon a recent examination of the accounts of the Collector of Real Estate Duties at Launceston, it has been found that the accounts have been kept in a most unsatisfactory manner, and that there is an apparent deficiency of £143 14s. 3d., arising from omissions to enter amounts received in the cash book, and other errors; it also appears that a much larger amount of Duties and Rates remains uncollected than is necessary if proper means had been taken to get them in. A full report of the circumstances was forwarded on the 28th and 30th June for the information of the Governor in Council, in accordance with Section 48 of the Regulations under the Audit Act, No. 3.

Pastoral Leases.—No further information has been forwarded to this Department respecting the arrears of rents due by lessees of pastoral lands referred to in my last report.

EXPENDITURE.

Ordinary.—The ordinary Expenditure chargeable to the Consolidated Revenue for the year 1883 already ascertained, amounts to £502,493 14s. 7d.; viz.—

DEBT OF THE COLONY.

The Debt is stated in the Balance-sheet at £2,528,700 on 31st December, 1883. This amount includes Treasury Bills for £60,000 raised for a temporary object, and excludes Debentures authorised but not issued. In giving the figures below the first amount is excluded, as also the sum of £300 for Debentures due but not presented for payment, and the latter included. The Debt will thus amount to £3,215,450; viz.—

PUBLIC BODIES.

Municipal.—The accounts of all the Municipalities (19) have been examined and passed, a considerable improvement in the time of rendering these accounts having been experienced, and, with the exception of Fingal, all were found in a satisfactory condition. On visiting the Municipality of Fingal the Inspector found a deficiency in the Council Clerk's cash of £100 6s. 4d. The matter was reported to the Council, and the amount recovered and paid in to the credit of the Municipality, and the officer in fault, Mr. Smith, called upon to resign.

Road Trusts.—The Road Trust accounts (84) have been examined and passed; the whole, with the exception of one, having been rendered in a satisfactory manner, the exception being Port Cygnet. As in previous years, this Trust rendered its accounts in a very defective state, causing much trouble before they could be finally passed. The Inspector also found on visiting the Collector and examining his accounts, that there was a deficiency of £36 0s. 3d. This has, however, been subsequently paid into the bank to the credit of the Trust.

Main Road Boards.—The Main Road Boards accounts, forty-six in number, including thirteen districts under the Commissioner, have been examined and passed. All these accounts were rendered promptly and in fair order.

Marine Boards.—The accounts of the five Marine Boards and of the Lighthouse Fund have been passed and published.

Cemetery Trusts.—The accounts of twelve Cemetery Trusts have been passed. Those for Coppington, Montagu, and Wynyrd have not yet been rendered.

Campbell Town Water Trust.—The accounts of the Campbell Town Water Trust have been examined and passed.

Tasmanian Main Line Railway.—The report on the accounts of the Tasmanian Main Line Railway for the year 1883 will, it is hoped, be completed and forwarded in a few days.

TRUST FUNDS.

Assurance Fund, Real Property Act.—This account has been examined and found correct. The amount to credit on 31st December, 1883, was £5172 16s. 6d., of which £5100 has been invested in Tasmanian Government Debentures.

Public Debts Sinking Fund.—The amount to credit of this Fund on 31st December, 1883, was £72,613 13s. 4d., of which the sum of £72,600 was invested in Tasmanian Government Debentures; viz.—

The sum of £20,700 has been invested on account of this Fund in Tasmanian Government Debentures, and £327 3s. 8d. placed at fixed deposit in the Commercial Bank bearing interest at the rate of 6 per cent.

Territorial Police Provident Fund.—This account has been rendered, and is now under examination.

Colonial Storekeeper.—The delay which has occurred in rendering the accounts of the Colonial Storekeeper has been a matter of complaint for many years. The 1881 accounts were not rendered until March, 1883, and in consequence of several vouchers not having been forwarded were not completed until the end of November; the 1882 accounts were not rendered in complete form until the end of December, 1883, and at the present time Mr. Huxtable has failed to adjust a balance of £235 standing to his debit in the Treasury books. The accounts for the year 1883 have not yet reached this Office.

Inspection of Accounts.—The Inspectors have been fully employed during the year in most useful work: besides the several Departments of the Government, 87 public bodies and 64 Savings Banks and Money Order Offices have been visited, the accounts examined, and adjusted when necessary.

APPENDIX B.

CONTINUATION of Correspondence in connection with £7000 Loan to Campbell Town Water Trustees.

THE Report of the Colonial Auditor was not obtained before making the advance or loan, the case not being an excess in expenditure under the authority of the Governor in Council as previously defined, but a temporary advance or loan to a public body on the Treasury receiving ample security for the repayment of the amount. The Governor's Warrant was not obtained, as it was considered unnecessary in this case.

SECTION 19 of the Regulations under the Audit Act provides that "it shall not be lawful for the Governor in Council to authorise any expenditure of public money for purposes not recognised or provided by Parliament except in cases of emergency"; and the provisions of Section 6 of the Audit Act, 22 Vict. No. 6, evidently mean that money can only be legally issued out of the Public Revenue by the Treasurer under the Governor's Warrant.

The transaction is therefore illegal, and the reply given by the Assistant Treasurer is not considered satisfactory.
