

# FOR CONSTRUCTING BRIDGES AND CLEARING TRACKS BETWEEN TABLE CAPE, CIRCULAR HEAD, AND THE DUCK RIVER.

#### VOTE-£6000.

The contract of Messrs. Brown, Swain, and Lennard, for clearing deviations on road from the Detention River through Messrs. Chapman, Carroll, and Dallas' lands to its junction with Mr. Dooley's survey at the  $5\frac{1}{2}$  mile peg, a distance of 5 miles  $14\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabout, at £78 per mile, and from 8 miles 33 chains on Dooley's survey to the 10th mile, length 1 mile  $22\frac{1}{4}$  chains or thereabout, at £33 per mile, is bordering on completion.

The works of forming, draining, metalling, and putting in culverts, &c. under C. B. M. Fenton's contract, on road from the River Inglis to Jacob's Boat Harbour, have been completed; but the claim for balance on account thereof has not yet been paid.

#### FOR CUTTING TRACKS THROUGH CROWN LANDS.

#### VOTE-£2000.

Upon the representation of District Surveyor Hurst, that a horse track cut from the Patersonia cart track to George's Plains and Camden Rivulet would open up and render available for settlement a considerable tract of Crown land, the same was marked out by Mr. Hurst, and tenders obtained for the work. That of Alexander M'Millan, being the lowest, was accepted, and the work has been satisfactorily completed at a cost of £72.

On the recommendation of Mr. Laffer  $10\frac{1}{2}$  miles of foot tracks have been cut from the end of the present road at Nicholl's Rivulet, for the purpose of examining the land, and to determine the route for a horse track from thence either to the Snug or Oyster Cove, whichever may be found most desirable.

Mr. Laffer reports that this road will open up several thousand acres of land, a very large proportion being of the very best quality; and that no locality in the Huon District is so eligible for settlement as that in the vicinity referred to, having every requisite—good land, good aspect, easily cleared, well watered, about 5 miles only from water carriage, to which a tramroad may be made if required, and a jetty erected at Crooked Tree Point for a small sum, at which the largest trading vessel might load in all weathers. He points out the necessity of having an outlet made from this locality towards Hobart Town, in the direction of the Snug or Oyster Cove, in order to induce passenger traffic through it to make the country known.

In accordance with the recommendation of Mr. R. Hill, the present track to the River Arve has been cleared out from the 4th to the 6th mile, and a branch foot track has been cut from thence to the upper waters of the River Arve, and for half a mile along each branch of same. The reports show that there is a considerable quantity of good land and timber in the vicinity of the tracks cut.

It having been represented that it would be advantageous to cut a track from the police hut at the "Picton," along that river, in order to ascertain the extent of a bed of Huon pine timber reported as existing in that locality, tracks for foot traffic have been cleared by F. M'Partlan for a distance of 5 miles, and Mr. Laffer reports that a large quantity of pine is to be found in the neighbourhood.

### SORELL CAUSEWAY.

Under Acts 29 Vict. No. 1, and 33 Vict. No. 17.

The works at the Causeway have been steadily carried on since my last Report, and are now near completion.

The road approach to the Causeway at the Bluff has been excavated; the forming and metalling of the road, and trimming the slopes of the excavation, have however yet to be finished.

The excavation has been through a solid sandstone rock, the material from which has been used to form the embankment from the Bluff towards Medway Point.

This embankment is almost completed; about 35 lineal yards only remaining to be filled. The forming, metalling, and fencing of this portion have yet to be executed.

The timber bridging from the embankment towards Medway Point is also bordering on completion; a small portion of the planking and fencing, and a few braces to the piles, being all that is required.

No work has been done since my last Report to the embankment from the end of the timber bridging, or to the road across Medway Point.

The embankment and bridging from Medway Point to the Sorell shore are nearly completed; the fencing and metalling being the principal parts of the work to be done.

The metal for the roads and embankments is now being procured near the township of Sorell, and a tramway for the conveyance of the same to the site of the works is being constructed.

Some slight damage was done to the embankments by a severe gale from the N. and N.N.W. on the night of the 26th May last, a portion of the smaller stone with which the embankments were faced, and the clay at the top of the same, were washed away. The injury has, however, been made good by larger stones being packed into the vacant spaces.

The Contractors expect to finish the whole of the works (except the metalling) by the 25th July. They will require a further time to complete the metalling.

Tenders were accordingly received on 22nd December last for the necessary alterations, which have since been carried out under the contract of G. S. Gardiner, at a cost of £56 3s. 6d.

FOR DEFRAYING THE COST OF THE FORMATION AND REPAIR OF THE ROAD BETWEEN PORT CYGNET AND THE TERMINUS OF THE HUON ROAD AT VICTORIA.

# Vоте-£300.

Tenders were received on the 7th May last for clearing and grubbing on new line of road between Port Cygnet and Victoria, commencing at peg 3 miles 64 chains from steamer's Jetty, near Lot 4670 (G. & J. Batchelor), on Cradoc Road, and terminating at or near the north boundary fence on Lot 322 (J. Clark), a distance of about 2 miles 69½ chains. That of W. J. Hill at £60, being the lowest, was accepted, and the work is now progressing; but no payment has yet been made on account thereof.

When this contract is completed, the balance of the vote will be expended in cutting, draining, and putting in culverts on the road.

# Port Cygnet Road.

Tenders were received on 7th May for erecting a log bridge, in one span of 24 feet, with railing of sawn timber, and approaches forced on each side, over the Agnes Rivulet, at the terminus of the Port Cygnet Road, about 3½ miles from shipping place.

That of Martin Fitzpatrick at £22, being the lowest, was accepted; the timber is now being obtained, and the work will be completed forthwith.

The cost is to be defrayed out of the balance of £56 2s. 4d., on vote for Port Cygnet Road under 29 Vict. No. 1, which was reserved for this purpose; £300 being transferred to the Cradoc Road under Act 35 Vict. No. 2.

# FOR DEFRAYING THE COST OF COMPLETING THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE HUON ROAD.

....Vоте—£1000.

Tenders were received on 28th February last for rubbling, metalling, blinding, and other works on the Huon Road, between the 13th and 17th miles.

That of Messrs. W. C. Grubb & Bros. at £460, being the lowest, was accepted; and the works are reported by the Contractors as completed, but have not yet been taken over.

In order to prevent damage by the heavy rains to that portion of the road between Leslie and the 13th mile, two labourers have been employed for two months past, and are still engaged, in clearing drains and culverts and filling ruts.

Considerable injury was done to the Bridge over the North West Bay River, on the Huon Road, during the late flood; the approaches on the Huon side were washed away, and the abutment undermined. The damage is now being made good.

# FOR DEFRAYING THE COST OF WIDENING AND COMPLETING THE CONSTRUC-TION OF A HORSE TRACK FROM SURGES BAY TO PORT ESPERANCE.

Vote—£500.

Tenders were received on 6th April last for clearing and grubbing this track to a further width, for a distance of about 4 miles and 22 chains, in order to make it available for cart traffic. That of Messrs. Thompson Bros. at £224, being the lowest, was accepted, and the work is being proceeded with. On its completion the balance of the vote is proposed to be expended in draining and putting in culverts, &c.

Clearing, forming, constructing drains and culverts, &c. between Mr. Warland's and George's River Bridge, under tender of Messrs. Rosier and Drane, at £47 10s.

Cutting round a hill too steep to get up, about  $2\frac{1}{2}$  chains, filling up for 15 feet a sharp turn over a gully, and making a small culvert, under tender of George Nichols, at £5.

The old bridge over Power's Rivulet being unsafe, a new one, with a span of 15 feet, and log abutments, has been erected under contract of Richard Terry at £26; and a relief culvert, to prevent damage by flood waters, has been put in at a cost of £3.

# ROADS AND BRIDGES, CASTRA.

Against £2500 authorised by Governor in Council, 12th June, 1871, under the provisions of the Act.

The work of clearing and grubbing on the West Castra Road, from the Old Gawler Road to Colonel Fulton's north side line, and thence to Major Dumbleton's south boundary, a distance of about 14 miles and 2 chains, under tender of William Andrews, at £767, has been completed; and William Andrews' contract for clearing and grubbing the branch road from same to the north boundary of the Lot taken up by J. H. Dundas, a distance of nearly 8 miles, at £115 per mile, is on the point of completion.

The clearing, grubbing, and other works on the extension of the East Castra, or Main Road from Ulverstone to Castra, and the branch from the same towards the River Wilmot, a distance of about 6 miles and 58 chains, have been completed under tender of Wm. Andrews, at £520.

Tenders were received on the 28th February last for clearing, grubbing, &c. on East Castra Road, (branch to the East and West Gawler Rivers), a distance of about  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles, and that of John Regan at £75 10s. per mile, being the lowest, was accepted. The work is progressing satisfactorily.

A further expenditure will be required on these roads to make them passable for vehicles.
