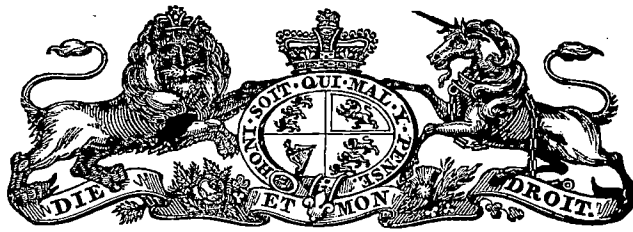

*To the President and Honorable Members of the Legislative Council.*

WE, the undersigned Women in the employment of Mr. Peter Bulman, Woollen Manufacturer, Waverley Mills, humbly pray that you will not allow the Women and Children's Act, in its present form, to become law, but that it be so altered that we may be allowed to work fifty-four hours a week as at present. If the Bill passes in its present form we shall be compelled to take work home, which will cause us to work longer hours than we do now to earn the same money.

And your petitioners, as in duty bound, will humbly pray.
