MASTER AND SERVANT ACT.

Presented by Mr. Whyte, and ordered by the Council to be printed, 20 November, 1857.



To the Honourable the Legislative Council of Tasmania.

The humble Petition of the undersigned Landholders, Householders, Mechanics, and Labourers.

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

That whereas a Master and Servant Act recently brought under the consideration of the Honourable the House of Assembly is, in the opinion of your Petitioners, calculated to operate unjustly on employers and employed, and prove detrimental to the best interests of both parties, by diminishing the confidence that ought to exist in such a close relationship, and eventually preventing the formation of engagements: we therefore humbly solicit your Honourable House to take into favourable consideration the Resolutions adopted at a Meeting held at Swansea on the 12th day of November, 1857, copies of which we transmit with this our humble Petition.
