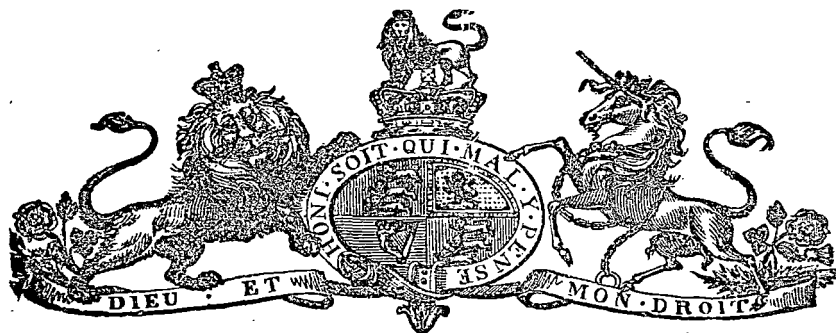

ELECTRIC TELEGRAPH.

RETURNS SHOWING THE RECEIPTS OF THE LAND LINES
AND SUBMARINE CABLE FROM MAY 1, 1870, TO APRIL
30, 1871, INCLUSIVE.

SIR,

IN forwarding the accompanying Returns showing the business of the Electric Telegraph Department and Submarine Cable, I avail myself of the opportunity to call attention to the steady increase in the business of the Department since the reduction of the Scale of Charges in May, 1870, over the land lines in this Colony to a uniform rate of One Shilling for a Message of Ten words, with an additional charge of One Penny for every extra word; and the reduction in the charges made by the Governments of South Australia, Victoria, and New South Wales to a similar scale. The Telegraph Construction and Maintenance Company, on the representations made by this Government, also reduced the charges from 5s. to 4s. for a Message of Ten words passing through the Cable.

These reductions have greatly improved the business of the Department; the total receipts from all sources for the year ending 30th April, 1870, being £4733 15s., of which sum £2561 12s. 5d. was paid over to the Cable Company, £863 12s. 6d. to the other Colonies, and £1308 10s. to the Colonial Treasury, Tasmania,—the Land Lines in this Colony, exclusive of the Cable business, producing £781 3s. 9d. of this amount. (See Parliamentary Paper, No. 32, 1870.)

The Returns now presented show an increase on the total business of the Department for the year ending 30th April, 1871, of £479 11s. 4d.; the amounts standing thus,—total fees collected £5213 6s. 4d., of which amount £2813 5s. 2d. was paid over to the Cable Company, £873 18s. 6d. to the other Colonies, and £1526 2s. 8d. to the Colonial Treasury, Tasmania. The Land Lines of this Colony, exclusive of Cable business, have produced £878 13s. 11d., being an increase of fees paid within the Colony of £97 10s. 2d. notwithstanding the great reduction in the charges. In addition to the fees collected by the Department, there is a great amount of work performed in connection with Shipping and Free Telegrams on Public Service, which in reviewing the work of the Department cannot be overlooked.

The Returns now submitted show that the Submarine Cable Company have received fees during the two years ending 30th April, 1871, amounting to £5374 17s. 7d.; in addition to which the sum of £8400 has been paid for interest on £70,000, the cost of construction.

I have the honor to state for the information of the Honorable the Colonial Treasurer, that the different lines in this Colony have lately undergone a thorough repair, and are now in efficient working order.

I append a list of the Telegraph Offices in Tasmania; and early in the ensuing year the line between New Norfolk and Hamilton will be completed.

In addition to the Fees received by the Telegraph Construction and Maintenance Company for Messages transmitted by the Submarine Cable between Tasmania and Victoria, amounting to the sum of £2813 5s. 2d. for the year ending 30th April, 1871, the sum of £4200 was paid by the Tasmanian Government to the Telegraph Construction and Maintenance Company as guaranteed interest on £70,000, the estimated cost of the Submarine Cable.
