

## NEW TOWN CHARITABLE INSTITUTION FOR INDIGENT FEMALES.

REPORT FOR 1875.

Laid upon the Table by Mr. Crowther, and ordered by the Council to be printed, September 12, 1876.



New Town Charitable Institution for Indigent Females, 18th April, 1876.

Sir,

I have the honor to furnish the following Report of the above Institution for the year 1875.

There were 129 women remaining in the Establishment on the 31st December, 1874. Since then 112 were admitted, 85 discharged, and 22 died,—leaving 134 Inmates in the Institution at the end of the year.

The average daily number of women maintained during the year was  $133\frac{319}{365}$ , and the cost of each per head £13 2s.  $5\frac{3}{4}d$ .

The total Expenditure for the year amounted to £1756 12s. 10d. which is briefly shown in the under-mentioned Statement. The details are given in Abstracts annexed.

The Officers and Attendants were:—The Superintendent, Matron, Clerk, Cook; and I8 of the Inmates as Helpers or Nurses, who received a small payment varying from two-pence to three-pence each per day. The whole of the Clothes are made by the Inmates: they also do all the mending and washing for the Establishment.

By Regulation, such of the Inmates as are able attend Divine Worship every Sunday morning; and they are visited by their respective clergymen and sympathising friends during the week, who speak and read to them. There is a small Library belonging to the Institution.

The following is the scale of Rations for each person:—

6 ounces of Fresh Meat. 8 ounces of Vegetables.	ounce of Soap.	$\frac{3}{4}$ ounce of Barley. $\frac{3}{40}$ ounce of Pepper.

The situation of the Buildings is healthy, and the aspect very cheerful. The apartments are airy and capacious, and afford accommodation for 150 women. They were built for the Infants of the Queen's Asylum in 1862.

The Administrator of Charitable Grants is the Officer authorised by the Government to grant Orders of Admission under the Certificate of the Medical Officer. The admission or detention order is mostly for three months, and they cannot demand their discharge during the time; but such as remain in the Institution and desire to go out for a day are occasionally permitted to do so.
